The old friars who established missions all over this country were good judges of where to stop. This, like all the old cities of northern Mexico and Texas, has a spring. Here it comes out of the table land above the city, and at its source is at least 150 feet above the main plaza, and with small cost could be made into the finest waterworks ever had in any city. There is water sufficient for a city of 100,000 people.

Wood here is a great luxury, and it is well that there is dittle demand for dres. (No house here has a place to build a fire except in the kitchen or oven.) The wood is all brought from the mountains, five to ten leagues away, on donkeye, or, as we say, bures. I counted 102 loads of wood pass last Sunday morning, within fifteen minutes,




