

after the Wife Herself Had Failed in KERRVILLE, August 2, 1880. After his release, Spray's wife would not, under any circumstances, permit him to come to the house or to talk with his children in the streets. Things went on in this way from that time to the present, the friends of both parties having become discouraged in trying to effect a compromise or in trying to get Spray to leave the country, and the citizens generally became thoroughly disgusted with both, as each would tell his or her side of their domestic troubles.

Previous to Spray's arrest, he and his wife Previous to Spray's arrest, he and his wife opened a boarding house, which she has continued to run, and among the boarders was one man whom Mrs. Spray rather depended upon for advice or counsel.
