BY A BURNING MARCH, HE INTERCEPTS VICTORIES AND ROUTS HIS ENEMY

Detailed Account of the Fight—Capt. Kennedy's Luck

The following telegram was received at headquarters night before last, and was yesterday placed at the disposal of our reporter

While regarding the passage east of Van Horn, and scouting towards the Rio Grande, to prevent the Indians passing eastwards to the settlements, they slipped through west of Van Horn, going north, on the evening of August 10th

This information received from my patrol, a few days afterward, I got my command at once in readiness and moved northward, keeping the range mountains between myself and the Indians, which effectively prevented their observing the movement

On the 11th, I left camp nearly ten miles south of Van Horn, at 7 a. m. on the 10th, and arrived at Rattlesnake Springs at twelve that night, a distance of thirty-five miles without making any mistake and found myself, as intended, in advance of the Indians

As my movement was unknown to them, I placed two companies early yesterday morning in Rattlesnake cañon to await their arrival, having previously located their camp

GEN. HANCOCK'S DAUGHTER

A Ministering Angel to Wounded and Dying Soldiers—A War Reminiscence by a Former Officer Under General Hancock

In the Public, Col. Democrat we find an interesting reminiscence of the rebellion from the pen of E. J. Maxwell, who was an officer in the second army corps under Gen. Hancock. He writes as follows:

The nomination of that magnificent soldier and statesman, General Winfield S. Hancock, recalls to my mind an incident connected with his celebrated campaign in the Wilderness, which made a strong impression upon me, and which I never forgot

It was after that week of terrible and bloody struggle, when, like two immense Titans, the federal and confederate armies were locked in a deadly grip, each waiting for the mastery over the other. The army of the Potomac had commenced that grand movement by which the forces of General Lee were gradually wasted and attenuated preparatory to the final struggle at the gate of the Capital city

There had been fighting and skirmishing all the way, notably at the crossing of the North Anna, and at Cold Harbor. There the two armies once more broke away from each other, and removed the race for the confederate stronghold at Richmond. On the evening of the 13th of June the Second Army Corps, with the supporting force of Hancock at its head, was ordered to march, except by his grand and heroic bearing
