More About the III Fated Steamer Vera Cruz-Collision at Sea with an Iceberg -- Great Destruction at Kingston, Jamatea, by Cyclone. THE ILL-FATED VERA CEUZ.

Savannah, September 6.—A special to the forming News from Jacksonville states that six seamen and passengers from the wrecked steamer Vera Oruz, reached that place from steamer Vera Cruz, reached that place from St. Augustine this afternoon. They, with four others, two seamen and two passengers, are supposed to be the only survivors. They report that a cyclone struck the steamer on Saturday, forty miles this side of Cape Canaveral, thirty miles off shore, at 4 p. m. The dock load was thrown overboard, and the sea swept the docks clean. At 2 s. m. Sunday the water reached to the engine room and extinguished the first and second mates killed while lowering boats, and by 6 o'clock the vessel foundered. Passengers and crow were provided with life preservers, but many were killed and crushed in the wreck. The survivors were washed ashore at Dayton and of the boarding cars, fell from the train and vivors were washed ashore at Dayton and Port Orange. Several bodies have been


