

CAPTURED

Save Feller, Tex., Nov. 12, 1880.

It will be remembered thaton or about the 10th of October, the Indians made a raid on the village for Los Yacas. Mexico, situated directly opposite the town of San Feller, with the Rio Grande river between. At the time of the above mentioned raid the Indians captured fully one-half the horses belonging to the cliticals and the company of soldiers at Los Yacas. They at once organized a campaign against the Indians under command of Col. Garcia, about eighty strong. This expedition started from Los Yacas atout the 20th of October, and on the 31st struck the home of the Lipans at a distance of len miles from Los Vacas. This examp was well arranged, both for comfort and defence, and was provided, with an atundance of provisions, including dried meats, dried and preserved fruit, forces, the thing approach of the Macket, loaving their horses and saddles, together with all their provisions and a considerable part of their clothing and arms. Two Indian males and one fem lie were killed at the camp.

Fifty-six horses, about fifty saddles, and as muca of the Indian wealth as could brought on the horses were brought back to Los Vacas, arriving November 3th.
