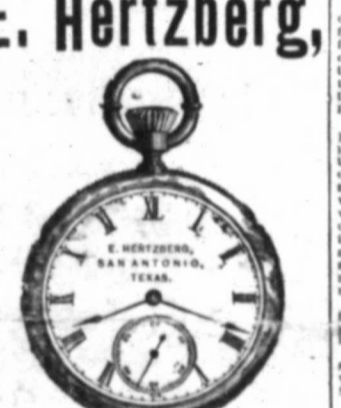

The treasury department has purchased 100,000 ounces of fine silver, for delivery at the San Francisco and New Orleans mints.

San Jose Johnston, chairman of the senate committee on agriculture, has prepared a resolution calling upon the public printer for a statement of reasons why the agricultural report for 1879 has not yet been printed.
The most extensive preparation for the celebration of the centennial anniversary of the surrender of Cornwallis at Yorktown are well progressing, and the affair will be the grandest of the kind ever known in the history of the country.

Glenn's law is an interesting situation for a nervous and self-determined man. If he does not adopt effective measures four of his cabinet will resign, if he does adopt them two of his cabinet will resign. It is said that Glenn is paying mighty little attention to literature just now.

Some members of congress feel disposed to limit the usual holiday vacation to a half day business men in the country, with such important matters demanding their attention as congress finds, would think of taking a week's holiday, but then, congressmen are not generally supposed to be business men.

It is said Judge Manning is determined to find out what his commission as executor to Bradford, late executor for the Kellogg estate in congress, is worth at a very early day. Such a declaration shows that Manning knows nothing of the ways of congress. He cannot calculate on years, not days, when he expects any special legislation from that body.

THE COUNTY FINANCIAL DIFFICULTY.
In response to the request of the county commissioners, Judge T. J. Devine addressed a communication to that body suggesting no means by which the legislature could be induced to repeal the law which he thinks it could be obtained through a repeal of the bull-punch law and the imposition of a substantial license tax. He says if a county tax of \$250 be levied on sixty saloons, the difficulty of covering the anticipated deficiency will be overcome. But we fear difficulties will be found in the way of obtaining early relief by that means. We believe the bull-punch law will be repealed, but a variety of difficulties promise to present themselves in connection with the enactment of a new statute. Under the old law the license tax was \$50 a year, while under the bull-punch law an advance payment of only \$270 is required, and if other saloons are to be judged by this one, that was the sum total of the contribution of more than nine-tenths of the saloon keepers of the state. While they have been crying out against the law, they have made, by violating it, an average of about seventy five dollars each.

For that year ending Oct. 1, 1879, the county received from liquor and beer licenses, under the old law, about \$7,500, under the bull-punch law the revenue was not less than \$3,000. To enable the county to realize the amount stated by Judge Devine, it would require a state tax of about \$500 on each liquor saloon, which is probably not a hundred or one hundred and fifty dollars more than the legislature is likely to impose, as to make the tax much larger than that would act as a prohibition in many places, or cause violations of the law which would result a greater loss on the state than the bull-punch law. With the number of saloons now existing in the county—55 liquor and 37 beer saloons—the county would receive a revenue of \$7,500, less the cost of collection, instead of about \$3,000 as estimated by the commissioners for the current year under the bull-punch law.

But another difficulty presents itself in the way of obtaining immediate relief by a change in the liquor license law. The existing saloons have renewed their licenses to run until October next, and would doubtless claim this as a contract that could not be changed during its existence. The legislature might obviate this by a prohibitory act by giving dealers the preference of accepting the terms of the new law or having the one under which their contracts are rigidly enforced. It is claimed that the bull-punch law cannot be enforced in some communities, but we believe the state can provide for the change of terms. It can provide for the change of terms from counties where it cannot be enforced to those where it can.

On the question of relief of Bexar county, however, we believe we will have to rely on something more than a prospective change in the liquor license law. If the old law is repealed, and the liquor dealers pay in accordance therewith, great assistance will be secured by that means, but it will not be enough to bridge over the difficulty to be encountered with our county saloons. We must find some other means to increase our revenues, or still further reduce our expenses. We believe our full expenses could be reduced without detriment to the welfare of the prisoners or endangers their safe-keeping. We have too many officers. The commissioners need not expect to find a bangle to stop up and thereby get out of these difficulties, they must look to the means of increasing their revenues, and we must look to assist the county out of difficulty.
