



Cour-tenay, the clerk and interpreter of the estab-lishment, in whom the Indians religiously ishment, in whom the Indians religiously believe. Mr. Courtenay was reading Whittaker's "Life of Custer," and in turning the leaves of the book one of the Indians caught sight of his own picture, which he immediately recognized. They then took the book from Mr. Courtenay, and found all their portraits, but exhibited very little emotion of pleasure or otherwise, until one of them turned a page and the picture of Gen. Custer was revealed. 
