Door-To-DoorPurchases

But what if you decide you on't want or can't afford the lerchandise you buy from a or-to-door salesperson? You dion cancel your order if you an an on't delay, says a Texas A\&M University Agricultural Extenion Service consumer ec. A Federal Trad. FTC) ruling allows Commission cooling off' period to cancel if <br> purchase is $\$ 25$ or more, Bonnie L. Piernot. This uie applies only to door-to-door sales and not in in-store sales. <br> The salesperson must provide a fully completed contract ncluding the date of the sale, name and address of the seller. <br> and a statement in large business type explaining the <br> right to cancell within "three days by written notice," she <br> "The salesperson must also give you ..two copies of a separate .notice of cancellation" form, Pierrot says. Then when you want to cancel the sale, simply send the notice by certified mail with return receipt requested si canceled it. <br> The specialist points out that the contract and notice must be | in the same language the salesperson uses in the sales pitch. If the sale was made in Spanish, for example, then the ast be in Spanish. <br> If you have made payment, the seller must refund the money within 10 business days of receiving your cancelation notice, Piernot says. And after canceling the sale, you must have the merchandise--in the same condition that you rethe salesperson to pick up at your home. <br> If you agree to ship the item back, the seller must pay the shipping costs. But if the merchandise is not picked up within 20 days, you may keep the goods without obligation," she says. Natural dyes can come from a How Much Salt <br> In Snack Foods <br> If you like to munch on chips or other salty snacks, you may want to know exactly how much wodium you're getting. Some manufacturers list sodium amounts in milligrams per serving on food labels, but they are not, required to do so, says Texas $\begin{aligned} & \text { A\&M } \\ & \text { Extension }\end{aligned}$ University Service nutritionist Mary K. Sweeten. However, a recent study of 15

 popular national brand snack Food Science, provides someinformation on their sodium content, she says.
Researchers determined the Researchers determined the
average amount of salt in 100
grams -- or about $31 / 2$ ounces -of the snack. A typical single serving size bag of chips
contains one to two ounces. contains one to two ounces.
Of the products tested, pretzel twists had the most
sodium with 2370 milligrams per serving. But saltines with
1994 milligrams, puff balls with
1190 . 1794 milligrams, puff balls with
1190 milligrams and some
corn-based snacks with 1014 corn-based snacks with 1014
milligrams are also high in milligrams are also high in
sodium, she notes.
By comparison, Sweeten says By comparison, Sweeten says
that 1100 to 3300 milligrams of sodium is the recommended
amount for daily intake. "Even one serving of these snacks, assuming you can eat
just one, provides a substantial just one, provides a substantial
amount of the amount of the day's allotment
for sodium," says the nutri"Oionis. "Obviously, the salt content of different brands
and the quantity of salt you eat depends on how much and how often you eat these snacks,"
Sweeten Sweeten maintains. She also explains that the
