



Registers to be used for covering the openings left in the sidewalks of any street, plaza, public lane or alicy for lighting and ventilating the cellars of any house or building within the limite of this city, shall be made in such a manner that they will be entirely safe for persons walking across the same, and the iron bars used for said grating shall be of heavy iron, and not over one inch apart.

But no grate hereafter constructed shall extend or project into the sidewalk more than twenty-four inches beyond the building line. Nor shall any step, or steps, be allowed upon any pavement or sidewalk, unless the inter be more than eight feet in width, and in that even they may be allowed by the council, so long at they may not be considered an obstruction to such sidewalk. 


