If the boys are put upon the streets with ball and chain attached, the citizens would cry out "banish the rascals," etc., that the boys should be publicly degraded and treated as hardened criminals. But to organize them into a street sweeping gang appears to be about the only legal corrective measure within the city's power, and it should be applied. Something must be done to prevent the young set from doing an example also for the benefit of others.
