A VISIT TO THE CHARITY HOSPITAL.

Important Improvements - The Sick Room - A Scene in the Orphan's Play Room.

In company with city physician Meager, at 8:30 a. m. yesterday, the reporter visited the Catholic charity hospital, west of the San Pedro, the main purpose being to note important improvements that are being made on the building.

The institution is in charge of the sisters of charity, who are entering the building to good and satisfactory condition of the suffering poor. A number of mechanics, tinners and painters were found at work making additions to the building and finishing up a dispensary apartment. Walking about the building, improvements were noticed in almost every room.

The building has recently been furnished with waterworks in their various apartments, and has been supplied with new furniture and bedding. The sick room contained a half-dozen men confined principally with broken limbs. Two or three of the cases were serious, but the patients are doing well. The sisters spare them no attention. When the dispensary is completed, the institution will keep its own drugs, which will be dispensed by an experienced steward who will accompany the sister superior, now in France, to this city.

The kitchen is supplied with a large range. A female cook is employed, but the reporter observed a couple of the sisters assisting her. Stepping into an airy room adjoining the kitchen, a most interesting scene met the eye, being a congregation of orphan boys, ranging in age from two to seven years of age. The plump and bright little fellows were lying upon the floor among their simple toys. Presently, Father Genolin, one of the parish priests, arrived, and walked into the room to greet the little boys.

The scene that followed was a most touching one. As the priest entered the door to the apartment, the little boys jumped to their feet, and clapped their arms about him, not speaking a word. They looked at him with admiration and awe, and the little fellows were not dissatisfied or bashful, but the slightest word would bring them to their feet, and the boys would be on their feet in a moment. The priest's attention was attracted to the writer's notes. These little boys either have no parents, or have been taken away from parents, and are thus left to raise up children in the proper way. They are kept neat, strictly disciplined, and while they are under the eye of the good sisters, and are taught those things that are calculated to elevate the soul.
