Some Tall Houses. From the New York Sun. The tallest private residence in New York will be one now in process of erection for William Pickhardt, at Seventy-four street and Fifth avenue. It will be six stories in and fitth avenue. It will be six stories in height, with a basement, a cellar, and a subcellar, making nine stories between roof and foundation. To balance the height above the curb, there will be a breadth of 52 feet and a de, th of 125 feet. The cept below the curb is 26 feet. The cost is estimated at \$290,000.

It is not known whether there will be It is not known whether there will be a steam elevator in this house or not, but there are elevators in many private residences in this city. There is an elevator running through four stories of the hou that William K. Vanderbilt is building on the north-west corner of Fifth avenue and Fifty-second street. Elevators are in operation in the residences of J. Plerport Morgan, Frederick F. Thompson, in Madison avenue; F. W. Stevens, Fifth avenue and Fifty-seventh street; J. A. Bostwick, Fifth avenue and Sifty-first street; F. Dickinson, in East Thirty-fourth street, and many others.

There is no limit in law to the height or depth to which buildings may extend, but the thickness of the salis must be such as to secure adequast strength. There is a practical limit to the depth of buildings in this citys—A very deep cellar will in time gather drainage from the neighboring sewers. Nevertheless cavarnous excavations of twenty-five feet depth are common. That is the depth of the building, in Broad street. The D. O. Mills building, in Broad street, will have mascony foundations extending only from thirteen to seventeen feet below the street level. The reason for this is the ground is marshy. Piles have been driven for the foundation to rest on. The building will contain nine stories its beight, 157 feet above the curb, will be balanced by a front on Broad street of 163 feet and on Exchange piace of 105 feet. 


