WASHINGTON, September 12.—At 10 o'clock last evening an attempt was made to kill Guitaux in his cell. At that hour battery B, second artillery, was relieving "apt. Grave's" company, which was on duty at the jail the previous twenty-four hours. Battery B arrived in three wagons, in the first of which was seated first sergeant Mason, the wagon drove up in front of the jail, Mason jumped out and threw his cap aside, and with musket on shoulder proceeded to the right wing of the jail. Putting his gun to his shoulder, the sergeant fired through the window, the bullet striking Guitaux in the chest, and he fell to the ground.
