LIVING LETTERS.

Forged Documents for Political Purposes—He gave the Gallic way.

RICHMOND, Va., October 14.—A few weeks ago two letters purporting to have been written by Frank P. Blair, republican candidate for attorney-general, were furnished to Hon. G. W. Wise, member of congress, by W. L. Wilson, a member of the same body.

These letters, which are known as the Blair letters, contained managing sentiments and were used in the present campaign to show his contempt for the negro, etc. Blair, from the first, denied the authorship of the letters.

The Whig, the republican organ, to-day publishes letters from Wilson confessing that the letters were forged, and that they were originally written by some one in Salem, Va., whose name he will not give, and then given to him, that subsequently, while drunk, the letters were extracted from his pocket and copied; and that he was then advised to take the stand and make a denial.
