WASHINGTON, October 8.—The indict-ment against Guiteau for the murder of James A. Garfield, late president of the United States, was presented to the grand jury at eleven o'clock this morn-

The indictment embraces eleven counts, and is drawn with great minuteness. The fifth and sixth counts are the ones upon which it is said the prosecution will mainly rely. They describe the shooting as having, been done at the Baltimore & Potamac depot, Washington, of malice aforethought, with a pistol, inflicting a mortal wound, from the effects of which the president died.

At 12:45 the grand jury entered the indictment against Guiteau.

THE CHARGES.

Following is a synopsis of the several counts of the indictment against Guiteau presented to the grand jury to-day:


