Postal Savings Banks.4

Postmaster James repeats the recommendations made by some of his predictions in favor of postal savings banks, which have been tried in Great Britian with decided advantage, both to the government and to the people, the amount which any one person may deposit being limited. In Great Britian no person is allowed to deposit mere than \$150 in a year, nor to have over \$750 deposit being limited.
