

THE BOCLESIASTICAL YEAR.

Comparatively but few know what is meant by the ecclesiastical year, and that it is an order of seasons and days appointed by the church, commencing the first Sunday in Advent, and ending with the last Sunday after Pentecost, and which is so arranged that every year the mysteries, doctrines, benefits, obligations and promises of Christianity are brought before the eyes and minds of men by appropriate solemnities.

Easter comes on the first Sunday after the full moon, which comes next after the vernal equinox.

Feasts are days on which the church celebrates either certain mysteries of relion, or some passage in the life of Christ, or the memory of the saints. They may, therefore, be said to consist of two sorts: the feasts of Christ and the feasts of the saints. These days are commemorated not only in the Roman Catholic, but in the Anglican, Greek and other churches. Their end is, that by their means people may be induced to meditate upon the mysteries, truths and benefits of religios.

The feasts of Christ, which are general to most of churches, are Christmas, Circumcision, Epiphany, Easter, Ascension, Pentecost, Trinity and Corpus Christi. Under the Mosaic law, Pasch, or Easter was established in memory of the deliverence of the Jews from boudage, Pentecost in memory of the giving of the ten commandments on Mount Sinai, The Feast of Tabernseles in commemoration of the forty years passage through the wilderness.

many of which are observed in other
churches. Circumcision, Epiphany, Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin, Easter,
