The latest crop reports from the agricultural department give the average yield of wheat per acre for this year has 10½ bushels, against 13 1-10 last year. The severe winter, the drought and insects caused a large falling off in the crop in the west, but the quality is generally reported good. Corn has yielded, on an average, 20½ bushels per acre, a falling off of about 25 per cent from last year's yield. The quality is not up to the average. The drought seriously affected the cotton crop in the south and the total yield will be considerably less than last year. In Louisiana the decrease is about 35 per cent; in Texas, 40; in Arkansas, 60; in Florida, 15; in Tennessee, 42; while in South Carolina, Mississippi and Georgia the crop will be about the same as last year.
