Month's Sport-Ergent Necessity for A Change of the Game Law.

Mr. E. Dosch returned yesterday from a month's deer hunt between the Carrizo and the Rio Grande. His party succeed-ed in killing eighty-seven deer. The party consisted of himself and Mr. James amonth's deer hunt between the Carrizo and the Rio Grande. His party succeeded in killing eighty-seven deer. The party consisted of himself and Mr. James Crawford, an old deer hunter of Atascose county. The deer killed were nearly all bucks, and some of them very large, fat and fine. Some time ago, this reporter interviewed Mr. Dosch on the state game law, and it will be remembered that he at that time strongly opposed the law as it stands for the reason that it only prohibits the killing of deer from the first of December until the first of June. During June, July, August, September, October and November, the law allows the killing of deer, while during the winter season, the only proper time to kill deer and bring in venison, the law denies the right to kill them. There is no sense in such a law, and more than that, it has the tendency to encourage the destruction of deer rather than to protect the animal. During the season when the law authorizes the killing of deer, the does are with fawn, or are mothers, and the bucks are lying up in the brush and woods while the does are upon the prairies with their young and fall as marks of the huntsman's rifle. Thousands of does have been killed for their skins, and to this fact is due the decimation that has been so marked with hunters. Unless this worse than useless in such a law, is changed, the inevitable result will be that we will soon have no deer. There should be a law prohibiting the killing of does, as is the case in Europe, where by the experience of ages the law-givers have learned that the life of a doe is of sufficient value to be protected by law. Mr. Dosch will unite with others who like the sport deer-hunting afords, and send in a strong petition at next meeting of the state legislature urging a change of the objectionable features of the game law referred to.
