The New York assembly, by a vote of 104 to 4, passed a resolution to investigate the charges of corruption against Justice Westbrook, of the supreme court of that state.

The conditions at Austin so far during the extra session do not appear to have been favorable to log-rolling for the governorship or senatorship. If much has been done in that connection it is in a quiet way.

A census of the City of Mexico is to be taken, the first since the time of the Spanish viceroys. It will show the greatest population to date of any city in the world, as it has long been a mystery where the teeming crowds that throng its streets by day sleep at night.

The proceedings of the lower branch of the legislature for Monday were received last Monday night that it was impossible to publish them yesterday morning. They will be found on the third page of this issue.

ELKHORNER will be found the report of the house committee on senatorial and representative appointments, and also the unanimous approval of the committee. It will doubtless be adopted with little if any change.

The Ohio legislature has passed an amended law against selling liquor on Sunday, the penalty being \$100 fine and imprisonment not exceeding thirty days, and Cincinnati wants to be annexed to Kentucky. The law will make the fortune of Covington in a very few Sundays, for the Cincinnati man "must have his beer."

The Dallas Herald wants the state re-districted so as to return the present congressmen. The Express has no objection to returning the present delegation, with the exception of Mr. Jones, but it wants the men to fit themselves to the districts, not fit the districts to the men. A good man is not likely to be left by the change of a county or two in his district.

It is authoritatively announced that the Texas college extension to San Francisco has been approved, all arrangements having been perfected. The excursion will leave Houston on Friday, the 24th inst., at the conclusion of the proceedings of the state press convention, which meets at that place on the 25th.

The republicans of State Island are exasperated to the greatest degree. An islander who has never voted anything but the straight democratic ticket has been appointed passenger in the custom house, and his republican neighbors want no greater evidence to prove that the country is on the high road to the old Harry and that Bob Toombs will yet call the roll of his slaves at the foot of Bunker Hill.

A correspondent signing himself "Ferguson," writes to the Central Baptist, St. Louis, a glowing description of Western Texas as a health resort. He came here almost a helpless invalid, and was restored to health. He concludes by saying his "language may be a little enthusiastic, but he cannot help praising the bridge that carried him safely over."

The postmaster general has written the senate committee on public buildings, recommending an appropriation sufficient to place one or two additional stories upon the present postoffice building, at a cost of \$300,000. The postmaster general suggests, as a measure of economy, the speedy purchase of the square west of the postoffice department, as it will eventually be necessary to purchase it.

EX-GOV. BROWN stated some interesting facts in his address before the joint committee on Internal Improvements, at Austin, Monday. However, his declaration that his road has expended a large sum of money in surveying lands beyond the amount received from the sale of such land, carry no weight, for the International long since withdrew its lands from the market.

The Fort brothers who shot Jesse James, or at least one of them did it, pleaded guilty to murder in the first degree on Monday, as mentioned in our dispatches yesterday, and were sentenced to be hanged on the 19th of May. Gov. Crittenden will grant them a full pardon at once. He would have released the attorney-general had no power to interfere, or pardon, until after sentence of the court had been passed.

WYMAN'S CONGRESSMAN speaking of Gutierrez a few days ago, said: "He has been very apprehensive lately, and prior to the last week had to take extra precautions to keep him from breaking down under nervous excitement. He realizes his position as much as any criminal under

sentence would, and I do not think he expects much from the court. He says sometimes he may have to go, as he says it, but still he professes to think that the president may, in the end, commute his sentence. He has had all his life a dependent as he was a few weeks ago, he is by no means buoyant, and I think expects 'to go.'"

What has become of Mr. Mack's bill, which provides for an assessment of railroad property at its true valuation, by compelling the roads to make separate lists, one of their aggregate property to the comptroller, which shall not be less in amount than the amount of the paid in capital of the company, and the other to county assessors, who shall not receive any addition at less than twenty thousand dollars per mile for each mile of road-bed and superstructure? We do not believe the railroads pay anything like the taxes they should in proportion to the value of their property. The railroads need regulating in this as much as any other connection. All roads are not equal in value, but they are not equal in the amount of their property. We doubt if any of them are worth as little as they are assessed at. We trust Mack's bill will not be lost sight of. Something of the kind is needed.

The old first Virginia regiment of infantry, U. S. A., made a triumphant entry into Trenton, N. J., on the 13th, going there as the guests of the local command of the Grand Army of the Republic. Early in the morning of the city put on a gala appearance, and almost every house displayed the Stars and Stripes. Along the principal streets, houses and stores were gallantly decorated, and visitors it seemed as if the people were holding a grand jubilee. The Old Guard were invited to visit Trenton by Aaron Wilkes, of the Grand Army of the Republic, while on their return from the Yorktown Centennial. The guests were royally entertained in Richmond by the men at whom they had been shooting for four years, and they determined to make hearty return for the hospitality, and their determination was carried out in the happiest manner on the occasion of the visit. The guests numbering about one hundred, were dressed in gray uniforms and marched to the tune of "Dixie" as they went up to receive the honors.
