Other men, with families to support as well, and who doubtless had been out of work, thought they were justified in accepting the wages offered by the strikers, and for this the iron workers were willing to attack by the mob of strikers, who entered in with pistols, knives, clubs, bars of iron, etc., in their hands, and beat them down indiscriminately in the most murderous way. The other passengers on the train fared no better than the iron-workers, for they were clubbed and beaten, five of them supposed to be fatally, one of the latter being Judge Pillsbury, of Pontiac, Michigan, just off the second district appellate court of that state. All the passengers were more or less wounded. A more brutal or inexcusable outrage could not well be conceived.

The crime for which the strikers desired to punish the non-union iron workers on the train, was going to work at their trade and accepting the same wages the strikers had been receiving. These strikers declare that in this great land of the free a man shall not dispose of that which he has earned at his own price. We have closely watched the reports of the iron-workers' strike, and in a large number of cases the men said they were satisfied with their wages, and were getting along well, but the Amalgamated Iron and Steel Workers' Union (I. S. W. U.) extends to nearly all the iron manufacturing plants, and they must obey. They must lose their destination and suffering upon their families, at the dictation of the managers of their union, who attempt to extort a grievance, real or imaginary, existing among a few members, by bringing trouble and suffering upon the rest of the union. The union are costing its members from one hundred to one hundred and fifty thousand dollars a day, and before the difficulty can be adjusted they will have lost so much that even if the advanced wages should be conceded, it will take the advance for nearly a year to make good the loss.

A more tyrannical power never was conceived than that of these trades unions when they fall under control of incompetent or unprincipled men. Among socialist monopoly never was created than they attempt to form. They attempt to declare just how many men shall be employed, and that those employed shall receive a certain amount of pay, regardless of qualification.
