

NATURAL BRIDGES.

It is commonly believed that me ural bridges, of which the natur bridge of Virginia is the best know American example, are due to the falling in of cavern roofs, leaving only a part to span the stream which the destruction of the cavern he brought to the surface.

By a study of the North Ada natural bridge Prof. Cleland h been led to the conclusion that i this case at least the origin is quit different. In this case the bridge seems to be due to the solution the limestone along a joint pla near the former course of Huden Brook.

At first only a small amount water seeped along the joint plane large enough to divert the entin brook under the surface, giving ris to the bridge. Walcott had previous ly offered a similar theory for the natural bridge of Virginia, and Cle land concludes that, while the falling in of cavern roofs may occasion give rise to natural bridges, the me common cause for such bridges in marble, limestone, sandstone ar lava is that outlined above.
