dynasty changed $400,000,000$ dynasty changed $400,000,000$
from subjects of an absolute ruler to citizens of the absolute self-governing nation larges earth. The first edict announced the abdication of the dynas ty after 300 years of absolute rule; the second declared that the throne accepted the repub lic; the third approved all the
conditions agreed on by Premiconditions agreed on by Premi-
er Yuan Shi Kai and the repuber Yuan Shi Kai and the repub
The third edict created grea astonishment. It had been ex demand the Manchus woul would safeguard many of their privileges but according to the proclamation the surrender is unconditional. The edict informed the viceroy and provin cial governors of the retirement of the throne with all powers and instructed them to con tinue doing their duty and to preserve order throughout the land.
It declared that the step taken by the throne was in order to meet the wishes of the The abdication of the Chinese throne by Pu Yi , the child em peror, brings to an end the powerful Manchu dynasty which has reigned in China since 1644.
The boy ruler has been on Throne since Nov. 14, 1908,
hen the emperor, Kwang-Si, his uncle, died. His father Prince Chun, was appointed regent and was the chief figur in China for three years.
