wo crops a year, the wool and the amb. As a weed destroyer on the arm, the sheep is above compare, forses and cattle eat only fifty per ent of the weeds and waste plants sheep eat ninety percent. They ven prefer some weeds, when reen and succulent, to grasses nd relish weed seeds. Joanson rass, which grows rankly along he irrigation ditches and tends to ecome a serious pest on irrigated
arms, is specially relished by the sheep. Every farm has some field waste, weeds. grasses, aftermath
rom harvesting and fence row rom harvesting and fence row which the farmer would like to se
turned into profit. A smass flock turned into profit. A smass flock
of twenty-five to fifty sheed wil
do this for him do this for him. Of course, while
sheep may subsist largely on wed and farm wastes. they do no make the best returns unless fed some bays and grains along with the wastes.
