At 6:54 (or in police lingo, 1854), Muleshoe City Police ed in by radio for a 12 -hour tour of duty on the streets of Muleshoe. Sgt. Bonham knew he had a passenger for his shift that night, and drove to the police department to read re-
ports and check up on activities of the department for the last 12

Bonham he was needed to take care of some business.
Then, the Sgt. went to the sheriff's office where Patrolman Maddox was booking his prison-
