W. C. T. U. HEAD ASSAILS HOOVER

WASHINGTON, D. C. — The rallying cry for dry forces denouncing the Hoover advocacy of revision of the prohibition amendment as foreshadowing a "destructive change" was sounded Friday by Mrs. Ella Boole, national president of the W. C. T. U.

The nation's press was divided for and against the presidential message.

The rallying cry was issued by Mrs. Boole from Seattle where she is attending the national W. C. T. U. convention.

"The proposed plan will be opposed every step of the way by dry forces," she said.

At Albany, Governor Franklin D. Roosevelt, democratic presidential nominee retired Thursday night without reading the Hoover acceptance speech, but plans to answer President Hoover in a series of road speeches starting Saturday at Columbus, Ohio.

There was a noticeable lack of comment upon the prohibition utterances of the president in the flood of congratulatory telegrams received at the White House Friday.

NEW YORK — The country's monetary stack of gold increased \$28,715,900 Tuesday, making the largest daily gain this year, the New York Federal Reserve Bank statement disclosed.
