## DELINQUENT TAX NOTICE!

Property owners whose taxes are delinquent for 1935 and prior years have another opportunity to pay their delinquent taxes for 1935 and prior years by paying such taxes in full before June 30 , 1937 with an additional $4 \%$ on the amount of taxes due. If advantage is not taken of this opportunity interest in addition to taxes will accrue on July first, 1937, on such taxes as follows: For the year $1935,171 / 2 \%$; for the year $1934,311 / 2 \%$; for the year 1933 , $431 / 2 \%$; for the year $1932511 / 2 \%$; for the year $1931,671 / 2 \%$; and for the year $1930,891 / 2 \%$. For instance, if a taxpayer owes $\$ 100$ in 1930 taxes and pays the same on or before June 30, 1937, the total amount will be $\$ 104$. If paid after July 1,1937 the amount due will be $\$ 189.50$, which will increase at an annual rate of $1 \%$ per month.

This is an opportunity for taxpayers to clear their property of all delinquent taxes for 1935 and prior years at a very much reduced rate and anyone owing taxes for such years should by all means
