| State Is 69,000 <br> As of April 1 <br> A total of 69,000 persons were reported employed on New Mexico farms on April 1 this year, according to the farm labor report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics of the U, S. Department of Agriculture. Of this number, 48,000 were family workers while 21,000 were hired workers. Some decline was reported in farm labor supply from April 1, 1941, to April 1, 1942, in all parts of the state. bor on April 1 was 64 per cent of normal compared with 65 per cent | at 93 per cent of normal, the same for both periods. The supply of farm labor as a percentage of demand on April 1 was 69 per cent as compared to 70 per cent on Jan. 1. <br> The special farm labor survey revealed that of the total New Mexico farm population on April 1, about 39 per cent were actually engaged in farm work on the home farm. The remaining 61 per cent were classified as follows: 24 per cent house workers, 1 per cent doing farm work off home farm, work, 3 per cent available for farm work, and 29 per cent classed as all others and including the aged, infirm, infants and children in school. <br> Of the total number of persons employed on tarms, the survey | showed 95 per cent were 14 years old or more and 5 per cent were less than 14 years of age. Of the farm workers, 90 per cent were males and 10 per cent were females. <br> Farm wage rates were at a relatively kigh level on April 1. Wages per month with and without board were about 30 per cent higher than a year ago, while a somewhat larger percentage increased was reflected in daily wages paid. Farm wage rates by the month with board averaged $\$ 39$, compared with $\$ 38$ in January and $\$ 30$ a out board averaged $\$ 56.75$ on April $1, \$ 52.50 \mathrm{Jan} .1$, and $\$ 50.90$ one year ago.
