**Delivery on Some Office Items Is Coming Through**

Although office supply merchandise remains difficult to secure, delivery apparently is showing a little improvement in some of the steel files and some of the other items.

The Advocate now has on hand three sizes of steel card index files, including single 3x5 size and doubles and singles in 4x6 and 5x8 sizes. The Advocate also has on hand two managerial two-drawer steel files. These are built on casters with slide back tops that makes them ideal for office use.

Although no four-drawer steel files are as yet being offered, two-drawer files in the regular steel are on order and delivery is expected soon on these.

Shortages are now appearing in ledger and journal sheets and the bookkeeping record sheets as well as other items in the Wilson-Jones line. Delivery is being made, but is extremely slow in practically all other lines.

Office furniture such as desks, chairs, etc., are still difficult to secure and although The Advocate has back orders on this merchandise no delivery dates have been secured.

Some of the other items are coming through and new merchandise includes two sizes of genuine rubber bands; new rubber pencil erasers, Shaeffer Fineline and Eversharp mechanical pencils; genuine leather brief cases, key holders and billfolds, small rubber type office outfits, steel cash boxes, storage or transfer files, and Liberty storage boxes, No. 15, the voucher size.

**Employment in New Mexico Is Showing Gains**

Manufacturing employment in New Mexico rose to a total of 9300 in mid-July after registering the sixth consecutive monthly gain beginning last February, and mining employment increased to a total of 9500, reflecting continued expansion since May, according to Edison H. Cramer, regional director of the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor, in Denver.

The rising trend in factory employment represents increases of 2.7 per cent since mid-June and 7.4 per cent over the total of 8600

workers in July, 1945. The gain during the month was due chiefly to seasonal activity in the food processing industry which added 200 workers to reach a total of 2400 in July. The increase during the last year, however, results primarily from expansion in the manufacture of chemicals which cause employment in other nondurable good industries to rise from 2800 workers a year ago to 3400 in July.

New Mexico mining industries employing 9500 workers in mid-July registered more than a 5 per cent increase over the June level of 9000 workers as significant expansion occurred in metal mining, coal mining, and crude petroleum and natural gas production. The July level, likewise,

is substantially above the figure of 8200 in July, 1945. During the year the crude petroleum production industry made the most notable advance—from 300 to 3900 workers, or a gain of 29 per cent. Coal mining rose nearly 18 per cent from 1800 to 2100 workers and metal mining employing 2500 workers in July was slightly above the level a year ago.
