muscle diseases," said Lewis. "We're going to pull out all the stops to learn if what works in the laboratory will work for 'my
kids.." kids."

every American who cares about every American who cares about defeating the scourage of mus-
cular dystrophy to support MDA as never before. To make the dream of cell therapy a reality, this year's Labor Day Telethon, seen on KLBK, Channel 13 , must

## IRA's \& the Tax Law

## Information on

 Individual Retirement Accounts As long as you are under $701 / 2$ years, employed and have taxable income, you may contribute up to ${ }^{5} 2,000$ each year. If you or your spouse are covered by a retirement plan, how much you can deduct depends upon income.The following chart will help determine if you may deduct your contribution.
