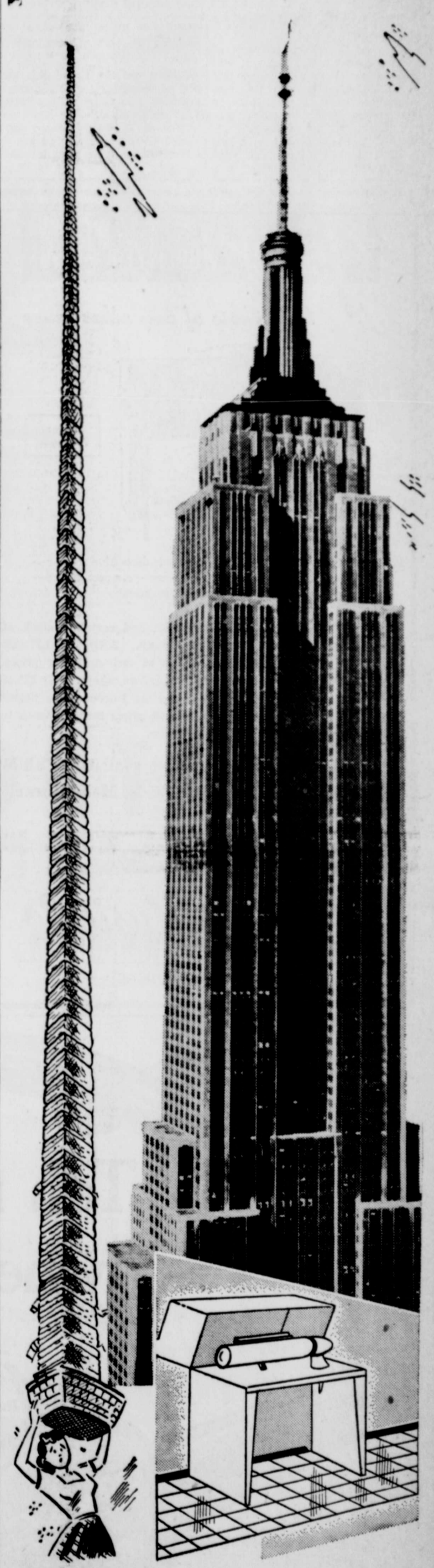

They were assisted in serving by their daughter, Sharon Ann and Beth and Marie Swinney, who are daughters of Mrs. Swinney.

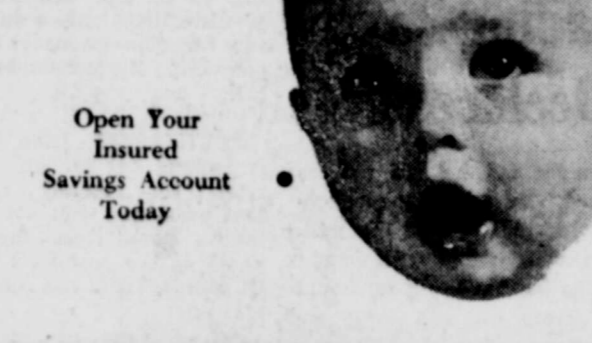
