## City Manager Talks With Rotary

 About Future Landfill Operationfellow Rotarian Dave Marr was introduced as guest speaker at Rotary Tuesday. George Nieman, who was in charge of the
program, asked Marr to speak on program, asked Marr to speak on and how new legislation will be affecting this area.
Marr's presentation brought a flood of questions from the Rotarians at the meeting. He started out by talking about the 1984 Federal Congress mandate as an amendment
Resource Recovery Act.
He said that in August, 1988, the Environmental Protection Agency published a set of proposed regulations for landfill operations, but final rules have
not been finalized yet, he reminded.
Ales county landfills and dump sites all over West Texas will be Lazbuddided Marr. "Such as been cose, who have already no open burning of trash. people (Lazbuddie) still generate a great deal of trash " he added "and we received 22 semi-loads of trash last Friday alone from Lazbuddie.,
The city manager said Mule-
shoe operates a Type II landfill,
which means Muleshoe does not have to cover the trash but one time a week. However, under new regulations, the trash must clean material daily. He spoke of gases which must e controlled. Muleshoe does not have the problems other cities have with methane gas, which is generated by garbage piles, not a problem here, but EPA says we must have a system to collect and disburse gas.
According to the city manager,

Warren said. An elderly abuser may show signs and symptoms of recurring falls, dehydration, malnutrition, increased forgetfulness and neglect of physical appearance.
Warren said the development can be triggered by significant life events, such as the loss of a job or the death of a spouse. Three type of drinkers exist, she said. The chronic heavy drinker who starts drinking early
in life: the in life; the reactive drinker who starts because of a major life
change; and the intermittent drinker whose drinking is unpredictable.
Warren said most elderly people are ashamed to admit they have a drinking problem because alcoholism is considered a moral issue.

of moral weakness
