## Healthy, Green Lawn

Needs Very Good Care

by: Spencer Tank

Lawns are a big part of our weekly activity from spring to have a healthy, green lawn that is free of weeds and is low in cost per month. This time of the year brings many questions to the Extension office about lawn are and maintenance.
Here are some of the most
common questions with answers or explanations: (1) What is the best lawn grass?
There are several good choices for our area of the state. Common bermuda is the most sun and is easily started from sun and is easily started from
seed, sod springs or by hydromulching. You can use a wide variety of weed killers on bermuda lawns without hurting the grass, and it stands traffic very well.
Some homeowners may want o plant bluegrass or tall fescue grass. Both of these grow better
under the shade of trees and where the home shades out sunlight. These grasses have good cold tolerance, green up early in the spring but require more water and weekly main commended are: Olympic, Rebcommended are: Olympic, Reb-
eld
will return nutrients to the soil for re-use by the lawngrass. If for some reason you're unable to mow that frequently while the grass is actively
growing, catch the clippings and put them in a compost pile. (5) What kind of fertilize should I use on my grass? Nitrogen is the nutrient required in the largest amount by lawngrass. Grass responds to nitrogen in a number of ways,
including density, dark green color, greater drought resistance, faster recovery rate and greater traffic tolerance. Bermuda grass requires $4-6$ pounds of nitrogen per year to maintain color and density
(6) How often should I water grass?
Watering is essential to
maintain a green turf. A general rule is to water as infrequently and as thoroughly as possible to give the lawn sufficient water. A lawn needs .3 to .4 inches of water per day during the hottest
months (June, July and August)months (June, July and August)
and approximately .2 inches per day in the spring and fall.
Infrequent watering gives bet-
ter growth and healthier plants. The optimum is to water once or twice a week. The best time of
day to water is early morning. At this time of day you should have the least amount of wind and less water due to evaporation.
