## A VOICE FROM THE COUNTRY <br> Agricultural Revolution Dooms

the G.I. binll 4,370,000 were actually
in schools or training establishments in schools or training establishments

filed an application, although only 61
per cent actually have entered train

ing.
Of this number, approximately

355,000 are disabled veterans taking
vocational rehabilitation
vocational rehabilitation. In addition
there are some 20,000
abled and dis-
veterans in Veterans' admin-
istration hospitals making profitable
use of their time in bed by studying
correspondence courses r correspondence courses ranging
from high school English, mathe-
matics and history to bookkeeping matics and history to bookkeeping,
farming and carpentry.
A large majority of these disabled
patients are taking the USAFI (U. S. Armed Forces Institute) course, and
