# Editorial

# A case the high court shouldn't have refused

In recent weeks, we were stunned by the decision by the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals in its decision that the national motto, "In God We Trust," wasn't a constitutional violation.

While we were pleased with its decision — along with a related decision that upheld the phrasing of our nation's Pledge of Allegiance — that the Constitution's "Establishment Clause" weren't being violated, it was probably a little too soon for us to cheer the actions of what has been described as our nation's most liberal appellate court.

Still, in all fairness, the most recent news about a decision of the San Francisco-based Ninth Circuit came not from out west, but from the eastern halls of the US Supreme Court, of which a majority refused to hear a case stemming from a student's attempt to play an instrumental version of the aria "Ave Maria" at her graduation back in 2006.

After the student's plan to play the musical piece was refused by school officials, who felt the musical piece was too controversial because of its "religious" theme, a lawsuit was filed and subsequently tossed out by the federal courts before advancing to the nation's high court.

We can't help but agree with the high court's dissenter, Justice Samuel Alito, who following the majority decision not to hear the case inferred the Ninth Circuit Court's decision could unnecessarily broaden the censorship powers and should be

We understand the need for a certain amount of censorship may be needed to prevent disruption during the learning process, but to prohibit a "student-led" musical piece because it acknowledges the existence of God — during a school function that isn't part of the leaning process, seems a bit extreme.

# "Productivity appraisal" may lower the property taxes on your farm, ranch or timberland!

Texas law allows farmers, ranchers and timber growers to pay property taxes based upon the "productivity value" of their land rather than on market value. This means qualified land is taxed based on its ability to produce crops, livestock or timber-not on its value on the real estate market. And it can mean substantial property tax

# When is the application deadline?

If your land has never had a productivity appraisal or you are a new owner, you must apply to your local appraisal district by April 30 to take advantage of this benefit on your 2010 property taxes. You may get up to 60 extra days if you have a good reason and ask for it by April 30. If you miss this deadline, you may still be able to apply, but you will pay a penalty. Check with your appraisal district office.

# Do you need to reapply annually?

If your land already receives agricultural or timber productivity appraisal, you normally don't need to reapply unless the chief appraiser requires you to do so. If a new application is required, the appraisal district will notify you by mail.
