The most zealous say that the whole big-dam program, costing billions of dollars, is useless, and that all down-river floods can be prevented by 'stopping the water where it falls'."

Surveys indicate that some of the big dam projects have actually caused far more destruction than they have prevented. And their cost is incredible. The missouri Basin is a prime example—about \$1,300,000,000 has been spent there so far, and the overall price tag would be \$11,244,000,000!


