How the Reds Attract Youth

Respected leaders in their chosen profession have great influence on the younger generation. Ben Hogan, the renowned professional golfer, attracts the admiration of every amateur in the country. Young mechanical engineers look up to Charles F. Kettering, the wizard of General Motors. The Mayor brothers inspire young doctors. Communism in America cunningly uses the follow-theleader impulse to recruit vigorous young people into its conspiracy.

Nowhere is this fact more clearly revealed than in the testimony of Herbert Philbrick, of Boston, during a recent hearing of the Senate Internal Security committee. He worked undercover as a counterspy for the FBI for nine years and became a trusted associate of national Communist leaders. His career with the Communists started early in 1940 when, at the age of 23, he was attracted to the Cambride Youth council in Boston. He was later to learn that it was created and operated by the Communists to snare and train youth for communism.

Nationally Known Professors

"Among the incentives presented to me to join," he testified at the Senate committee hearing, "was the fact that the organization had a number of adult people in the community who were something as sponsors of this organization. Farmers Lose Millions To Three 'Robbers'

Three "robbers" are taking milliens of dollars from farmers each year. These robbers are livestock diseases, parasites and plain care-

Annual losses from just two dairy diseases, brucellosis and mastitis, run close to \$200,000,000 a year, in addition to the losses from dozens of other animal diseases. Of all dairy calves born, 24 per cent never live to reach maturity. Of those that do live, only 17 per cent are still in the milking line at 10 years of age.

Ten per cent of all baby chicks and 15 per cent of all poults will not live 56 days. Only 60 per cent of the spring pig crop will live to reach maturity.

Additional minions of dollars of livestock losses also result each year from external and internal parasites. Finally, a heavy loss is caused by injuries and deaths due to careless loading and hauling of livestock to market.

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN TELEPHONE COOPERATIVE, poses of this franchise. INC., TO FURNISH TELEPHONE AND TO USE THE STREETS AND ALLEYS THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, application has been duly made by Penasco Valley Telephone Cooperative, Inc., for the granting of an exclusive franchise to construct, maintain and operate telephone communication facilities with- ATTEST: in the limits of the Village of Hope, New Mexico; and

and the Penasco Valley Telephone "I Flew Faster Than Sound . . . Cooperative, Inc., that such franchise

The Penasco Valley Telephone Cooperative, Inc., a corporation organized and existing under the laws of New Mexico, its successors and assigns, is granted a franchise to:

1. Erect, construct, operate and maintain telephone communication facilities consisting of, without limitation, exchange, toll, and trunk lines, conduits, cables, poles and exchanges, with all fixtures and appurtenances necessary or advisable for the proper operation and maintenance of such facilities within the limits of the Village for the purpose of supplying leiephone service therein and for the transmission of telephone service through and beyond the Village;

2. To use the streets, alleys and other public places of the Village or the space above such streets, alleys or public places, for such purposes;

3. To make all necessary excavations in the public streets, alleys or other public places and to cut and trim trees and shrubbery insofar as may be necessary to keep them clear of the poles and wires of the facili-

This exclusive franchise is granted on the following terms:

FIRST. The telephone facilities shall be constructed, operated and maintained in a proper workmanlike manner so as to afford all reasonable safeguards to the public.

SECOND. All poles and wires, forming part of said telephone facilities, shall be so erected, operated and maintained as not to interfere with traffic on the travelled portions of the streets or alleys; and the company, after the construction or reconstruction of said telephone facilities shall restore to their original condition the streets or alleys on which said poles or wires have been erected, constructed, operated or maintained insofar as this is practicable.
