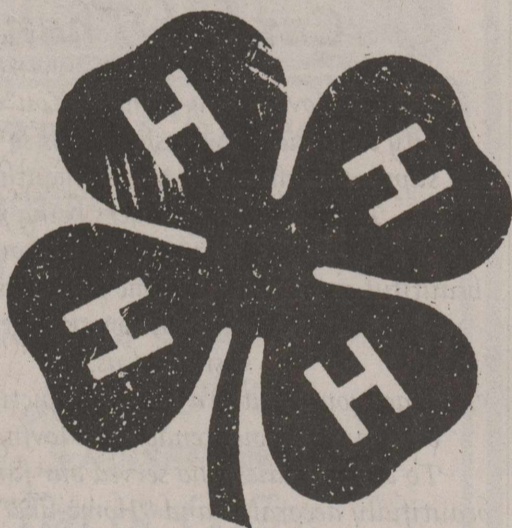

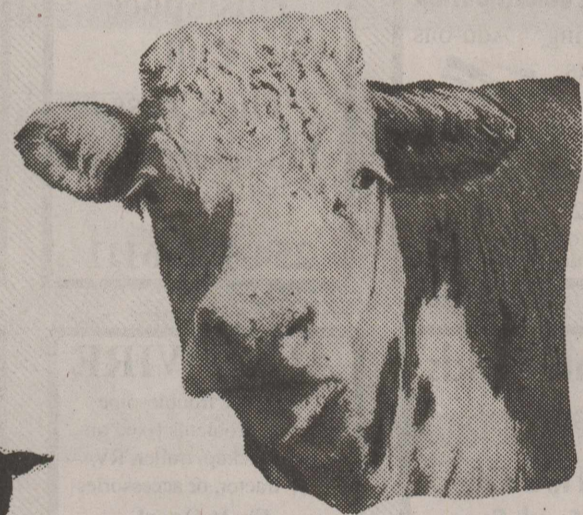
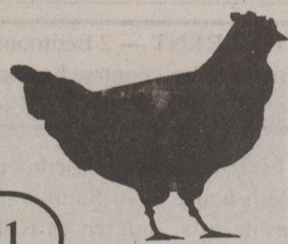

1 cup crushed graham cracker crumbs

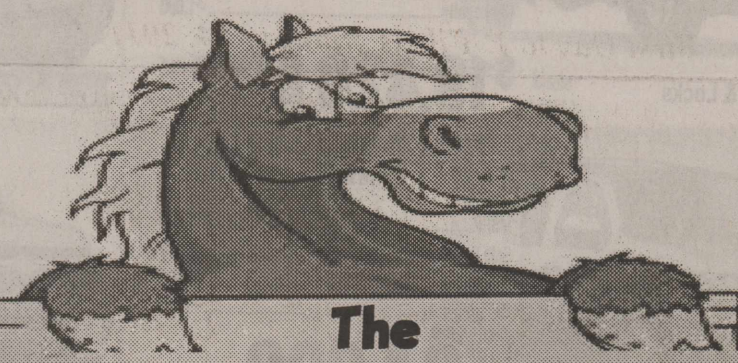
Mix well, spread mixture on top of graham crackers. Add another layer of graham crackers

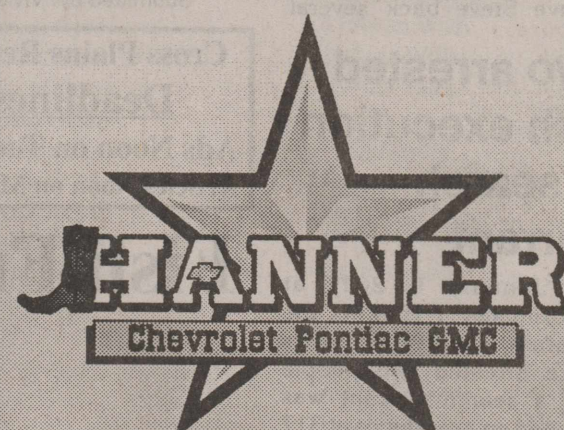

Farm Service Agency Disaster Program Sign up underway

(Baird, TX), Jan. 6, 2011 - Callahan County USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Robert Frost, announced that the 2009 crop year Supplemental Revenue Assistance Payments (SURE) program sign-up began on January 10, 2011. SURE is a disaster program that provides assistance to farmers and ranchers who have experienced losses caused by natural disasters.

"Natural disasters can turn what would be a profitable crop year into a year of hardship and financial loss," said Frost. "The SURE program is part of the 'safety net' that provides assistance to farmers and ranchers when disaster strikes," he said.

Texas FFA Hits 80,000 members

Austin - The Texas FFA Association announced that it added its 80,000th member last month, an all-time high mark for any state FFA association in the organization's 82-year history.

FFA, formerly known as Future Farmers of America, is a student organization that is integrated into the secondary education agriculture, food and natural resources curriculum. Texas FFA is a sanctioning organization for competitive events, scholarships and leadership development events.

Quardrie Lavan of the Houston-area North Forest chapter, became the Texas FFA's 80,000th member when he was submitted into the organization's roster system at 11:52 a.m. on Thursday, December 2, 2010. Lavan, a senior at North Forest High School, is a first-year member and is raising a pig to show later this spring. Lavan also played as a linebacker for North Forest's varsity football team and is interested in pursuing a career in the culinary arts.

The record membership

member level is part of a recent membership surge in Texas. Texas FFA gained 11,319 members between 2008-09 and 2009-10, the single greatest one-year membership increase in the association's history and followed it with a 5,288-student gain in fall, 2010.

The bulge in the state's membership rolls is the result of a program through which chapters can affiliate with the state and national organization on the basis of enrollment in the agricultural education instructional program instead of students paying individual membership dues. This is similar to how schools affiliate with the state's University Interscholastic League which

governs extracurricular athletic, music and literary activities.

Texas FFA has evolved from an organization focusing primarily on production agriculture, to a broader-based encompassing organization that addresses the needs and interests of students in urban and suburban schools in addition to the rural communities from which FFA rose in 1929. FFA gives students the opportunity to apply practical classroom knowledge to real world experiences through local, state and national competitions. 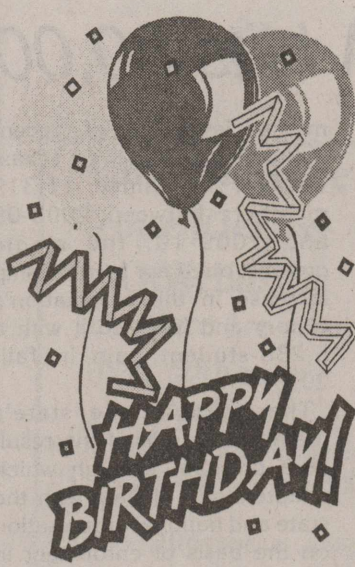

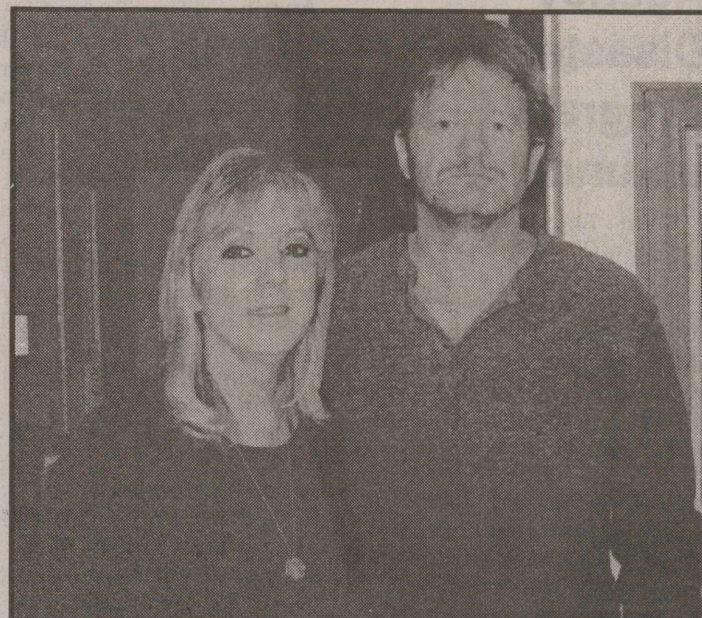
