dietitian suggested that problems may lurk in promises to rapidly melt away excess body fat.
"You should be leery of any
weight-loss weight a rate greater weight-loss weight at a rate greater
than a pound and a half than a pound and a half to two pounds a week," explained Regis-
tered Dietitian Dr. Mary Ann tered Dietitian Dr. Mary Ann
Gorman, chairman of TCU's nutrition and dietetics department. Most dietitians will classify plans offering quicker weight loss plans offering quicker weight loss
as dangerous, Gorman said. "It's usually weight that'll come right back."
Those
Those with few pounds to lose
can modify food consumption and increase exercise to lower weight. "There's a balance between intake and expenditure, and a healthy way to lose weight is a combination of moderate exercise and just lowering
the calories siighily every day " she the cal
said.
Gorman recommended eating 100
to 200 fewer calories daily. Depending on body size, as many as 500 calories may need to be cu from the daily diet, she said. "A pound of fat is 3,500 calories,
so if you want to lose a pound so if you want to lose a pound of
weight in seven days, that's going weight in seven days, that's going
to be 500 calories a day for the average person, she noted.
