SB 18 secures stronger eminent domain laws that will protec landowners. Highlights of the new law include requiring condemning entities to make a bona fide offer in writing and compensate landowners for loss of access to their property. SB 18 goes further to require condemn-
ing entities to take a public and ing entities to take a public and
record vote to initiate eminent domain proceedings, keeping them more accountable. Al
entities with eminent domai entities with eminent domain authority must also register with the Comptroller by Decembe 2012 or they lose their authority
Additionally, SB 18 give Additionally, SB 18 give
landowners the right to andowners the right to
repurchase their condemned land at the original price if it is not used within 10 years. SB 18 also put in statue that eminent domain can be used only to acquire property for public use, and that use has to
be put in writing before the be put in writing before the
condensation process can begin.
Groundwater Ownership Secured
Groundwater ownership rights were also secured in 2011
putting to rest any question of putting to rest any question of
who owns the groundwater below the surface of a landowner's land. SB 332 makes clear that
landowners own the groundwater landowners own the groundwater
below their land as real property, below their land as real property,
and clarifies that it is subject to the same legal protection as other private property. SB 332 also
recognizes that groundwater may continue to be produced and conserved while ensuring fair and impartial regulation of landowners groundwater

EPA Rural Dust Regulation Stopped
TSCRA and other agricultural
groups successfully blocked the Enviornmental Protection Agency (EPA) from imposing

## Toffee Butter Crunch

Ingredients
$1 / 2$ cup coarsely chopped almonds or pecans, toasted 1 cup butter
1 cup sugar
3 tablespoons water
1 tablespoon light-colored corn syrup
/4 cup semisweet chocolate pieces
$1 / 2$ cup finely chopped almonds or pecans, toasted Directions

1. Line a $13 \times 9 \times 2$-inch baking pan with foil, extending foil over edges of pan. Sprinkle the $1 / 2$ cup coarsely chopped nuts in pan. Set pan aside 2. Butter sides of a heavy 2 -quart saucepan. In saucepan melt butter. Add sugar, water, and corn syrup. Cook and stir over medium-high heat until mixture boils. Clip a candy thermometer to side of pan. Reduce heat to medium; continue boiling at a moderate, steady rate, stirring frequently, till thermometer registers $290^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$, soft-crack stage (about 15 minutes). Watch carefully after $280^{\circ} \mathrm{F}$ to prevent scorching. Remove saucepan from heat; remove thermometer. Pour candy into the prepared pan.
2. Let candy stand about 5 minutes or till firm; sprinkle with chocolate. Let stand 1 to 2 minutes. When chocolate has softened, spread over candy. Sprinkle with the $1 / 2$ cup finely chopped nuts. Chill until firm. When candy is firm, use foil to lift it out of pan; break into pieces. Store tightly covered. Makes about $1-1 / 2$ pounds ( 48 servings)
