Makayla Cheyenne Cowan Named a 2013 State Farm Texas Scholar







DPS increases patrols for **Memorial Day weekend**

AUSTIN - The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) will significantly increase trooper patrols this Memorial Day weekend to help keep Texas roadways safe. During the increased patrols Friday, May 24th, through Monday, May 27th, troopers will be looking for drunk drivers, speeders, seat belt violators and other traffic violators statewide.

"Memorial Day is a time of reverence and remembrance for all those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice in service to our nation," said DPS Director Steven McCraw. "DPS encourages Texans to mark the holiday responsibly by adhering to safe driving practices and by not drinking and driving. Troopers will be out in force, and are prepared to issue tickets to drivers disobeying traffic laws in an effort to keep our roadways






