

Design criteria are as follows; —Logo must be printed or drawn on 8.5" X 11" heavy white paper or cardstock (a file in be submitted on CD)

- —Design should include 'Cross Plains' and '1911-2011'
- -Margin must be 1 inch on all four sides
- -Allover design must be no larger than 6.5" X 9" and no smaller than 4.5" X 7"
- —Orientation must be landscape (not vertical)
- -Design should be simple enough to be reduced or enlarged with minimal distortion
- -Design must use no more than awarded. three colors
