The \$750,000 grant is through the Texas Capital Fund that aims to rejuvenate Texas towns' economies. Lufkin Mayor Jack Gorden said, "This will be the first 100% biomass plant in the state of Texas. So there's not that many others even in the country. It really puts Lufkin in the forefront of this mean, green energy concept." Aspen Power will bring at least 150 full-time jobs and invest over \$100 million in the city. The mayor says that the plant should be up and running, turning out electricity by the beginning of 2011.
