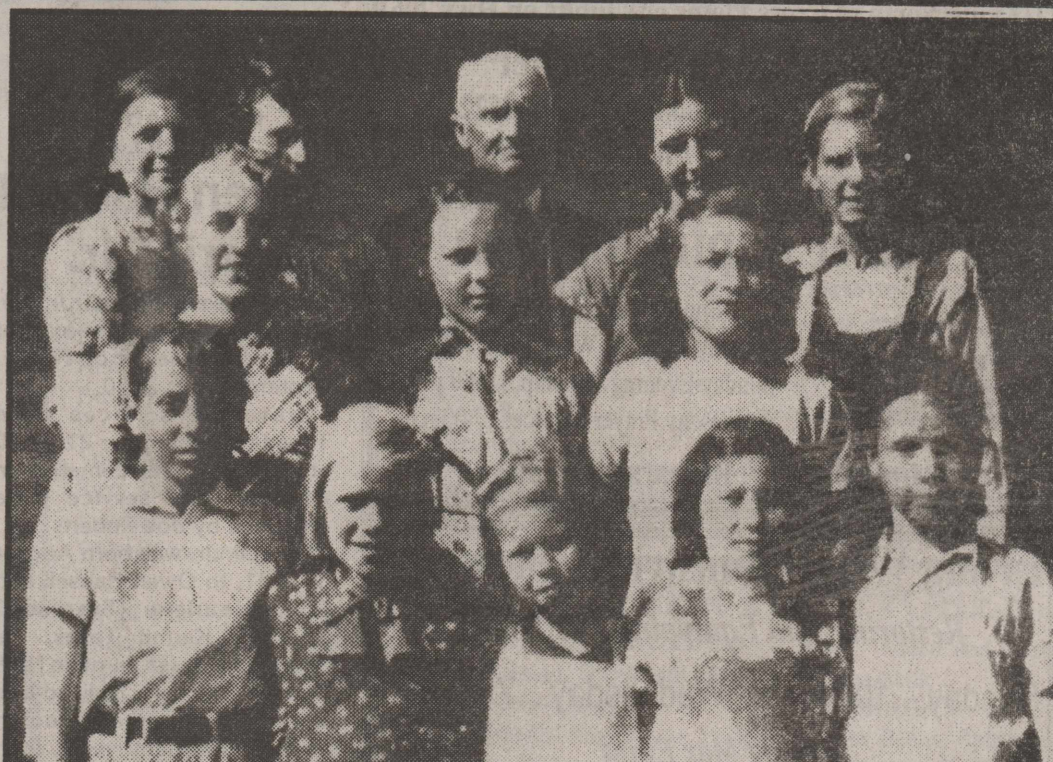

Her win not only gained her a title and cash, but also a beautiful set of Orrell Wooden stirrups. Amy's six year old cutting mare "Dulces Date" a.k.a. Shelly, was trained by her husband, Josh, who is a professional horse trainer. Amy never had a chance not to learn to ride. Her father is a former PRCA Champion Bronc Rider, and now a ranch manager. Her grandfather is the world famous Hall of Fame Cutting Horse Trainer, "Buster Welch." Riding was as natural to her as walking. Amy started riding horses as a very young girl. She began competing in Virginia where her dad was the ranch manager for Helen Groves, a descendant of the famous King Ranch of South Texas. Mrs. Groves wanted to relocate, so Amy's dad, Ken Welch, came to Texas looking for a ranch. He found a ranch south of Baird, which they now call Silverbrook Ranch. Amy, her two sisters, mom and dad all moved back to Texas in 1990.

Amy's riding has gained her great accolades in the cutting horse circles throughout the United States, but her greatest achievement, besides raising her two beautiful daughters, was being inducted into the National Cutting Horse Association Hall of Fame, December 14, 2008. 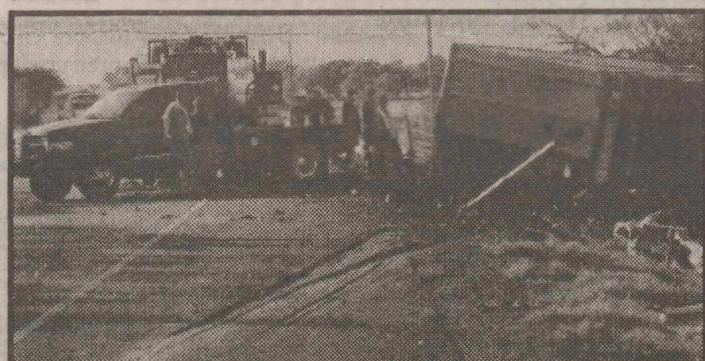
The department would also like to thank all the unselfish citizens who gave their time and effort to help rescue the surviving cattle after the traffic accident on 9-14.

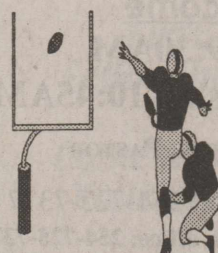

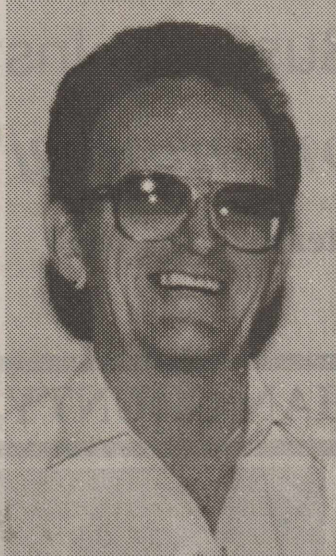

Owen Hansell Sherrill, Jr., 69, was welcomed into the arms of his Lord and Savior on Friday, September 17, 2010.

Graveside services were Tuesday, September 21, 2010 at the Cedar Hill Cemetery in Abilene. The service was officiated by Joe Roberts.

Hansell, Jr. was born August 3, 1941, to Owen Hansell and Ellen Mauriene (Starnater) Sherrill in Kermit, Texas. He attended Odessa Permian High School. Hansell, Jr. lived and worked for Brown and Root in Houston for many years, then moved to Abilene and worked for Target until retirement.

Hansell, Jr. was a very caring son and brother. His nephews and younger cousins considered him their adventurous uncle. "Uncle Bubba" took all of them to the beach, fishing, crabbing, and on many other outings to have fun. He made every trip special and treated them as if they were his own. Hansell Jr. enjoyed bowling, tinkering with almost anything, mastering crossword puzzles, boating on the lake, fishing, bird watching and genealogy research. He loved and cared for his father and mother diligently. He and his mother, Ellen, were avid Dallas Cowboy fans and enjoyed watching "America's Team". Several

years after her death, his father, Hansell, Sr., married Ida Gattis. Bubba welcomed her warmly and promptly blended into his new extended family. Ida's family has been very wonderful to Bubba as his illness progressed. Their kindness to him, the loving assistance of his sister Mauriene and her husband Don, and the attention from his nephews and cousins made the last year of Bubba's life very blessed.

Bubba requested that we encourage everyone to pay attention to their health. He disregarded a small spot on his skin that eventually developed into the dangerous squamous cell carcinoma that took his life.

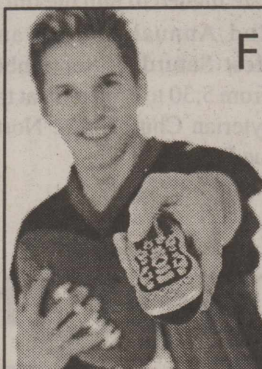

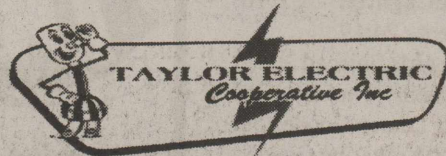

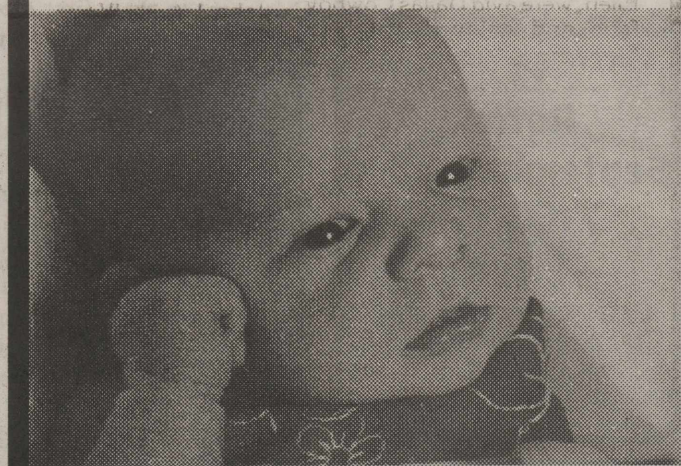

JAMES NICHOLS

B.R. Hargrove, Jr. was born in 1918 to Ben and Violet (Wilcoxon) Hargrove, Sr. He grew up on a farm near the Cottonwood community. B.R. and his father farmed and raised cattle there for a few years. They would drive their cattle (steers and young heifers) to San Angelo to the market place.

It was in San Angelo that B.R. met his wife, Ruby Wilkinson. They got married shortly thereafter and B.R. started buying and selling cattle plus a little horse trading, too.

B.R. had a butcher plant on a farm west of Turkey Creek, now known as the Raymond DeBusk place. There was a large set of pens and bull haulers (cattle truckers) would stop and unload their stock to test, as was the custom back in those days.

After butchering the beef, B.R. would haul them to town to the processing plant owned by Nick Nichols and Lindsey Tyson. The cost of having a beef processed was a penny a pound. Most country families rented a locker box there to store their beef in, seeing that rural electricity was just beginning.

When B.R. was in his mid forties he shut down his butchering business and began to concentrate on his cattle business.

His son, Jimmy Hargrove, stated, "I can remember this one story well." B.R. bought Wilda Edington, a well known rancher, a small herd of young cows on Saturday and put them in his pens out north of his home place west of Cross Plains. Unbeknown to B.R., Wilda and her hired hand took the cattle out to her ranch south of Cross Plains. B.R. came in late Saturday evening after dark and didn't notice the cows missing until Sunday morning.

He called Jimmy in a very excited voice saying, "Jimmy someone has stolen the cows out of the pens." After checking with all the neighbor places hoping they had strayed off, he called the Sheriff's office but nothing was accomplished.

B.R. decided to call Wilda and tell her what happened to her newly bought cows. Wilda heard him out and then just said, "Well B.R., Peppy and me picked up those cows Saturday evening and put them in my pasture. Ha! Ha! Ha! Well, B.R. was fit to be tied.

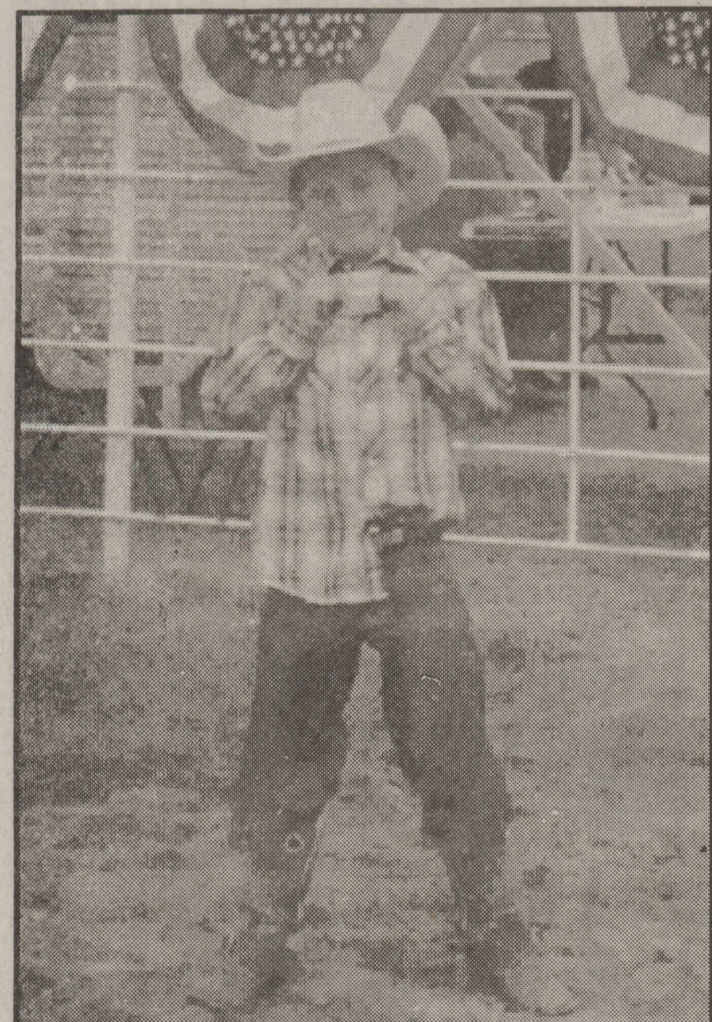

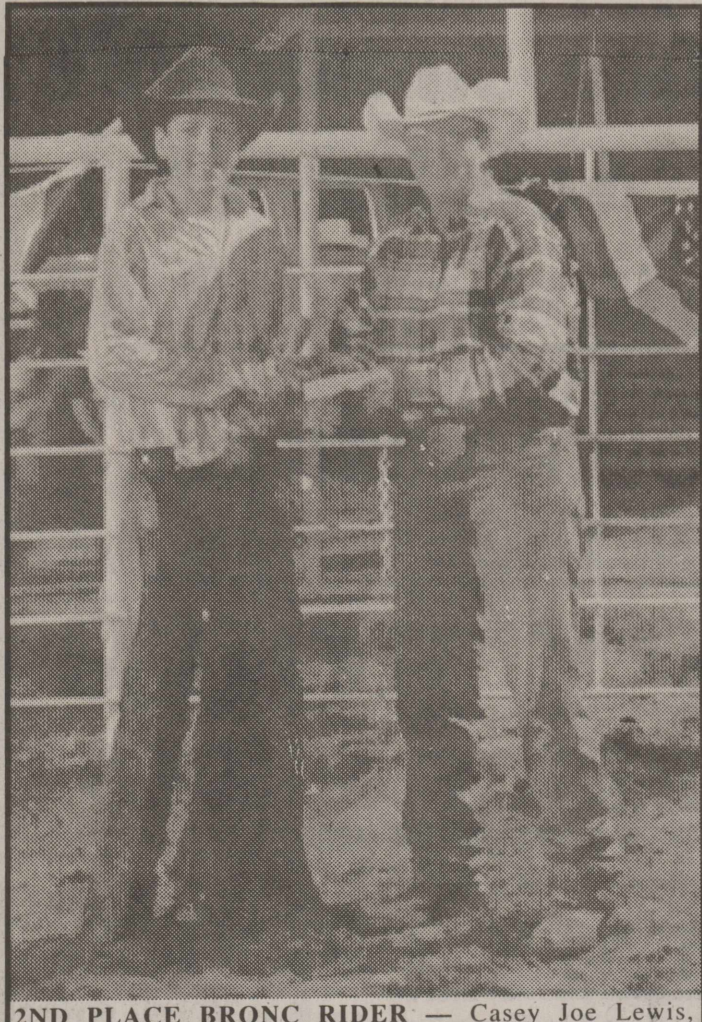

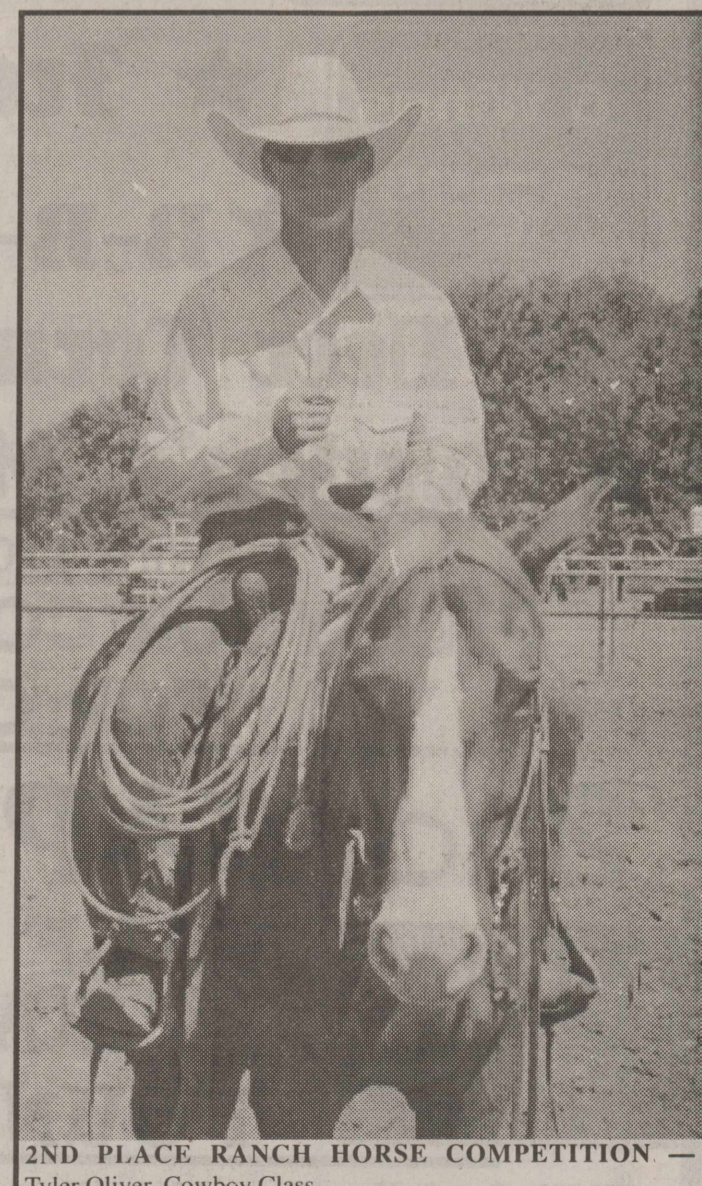

**Fatal accident on Hwy. 36**

On Tuesday, September 14, 2010 at approximately 4:00 p.m. a black Dodge Pickup truck driven by Wesley Fletcher, a 32 year old man from Brownwood, Texas, drifted over the center line on State Highway 36 and into the west bound lane hitting an 18-wheeler cattle hauler driven by James Rhodes of Springtown, Texas.

The two vehicles collided almost head on, nearly demolish-

ing the much smaller pickup truck. The cattle hauler's trailer flipped onto its side skidding off the highway through the guard rail coming to rest with the cab in a crumpled, but upright position and the trailer, with many dead cattle inside, on its side.

James Rhodes and wife Cindy, who was a passenger in the cattle hauler received only minor injuries and were treated

and released from a local hospital.

Wesley Fletcher's pickup truck was crushed from the impact and he had to be cut from the wreckage. He was flown to a Lubbock Hospital with very critical injuries.

Wesley Fletcher passed away, in the morning of Tuesday, September 22, 2010 due to these injuries, without ever regaining conscious.

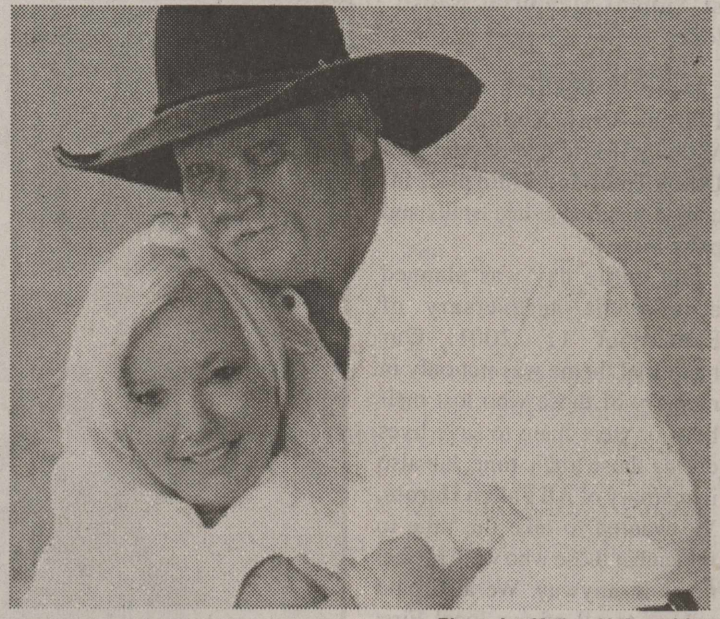
