As a general rule, most people have experiences as children that can ultimately define the very essence of who they are as adults. One of the first experiences from memory that shaped my herpetological life happened

when I was a mere six years old. We had just moved from the city to the country, and I had read in a book that one of the best ways to find reptiles was to look under debris on the ground. As a curious youngster, I took the advice of that particular book, and encountered my first snake in the wild resting peacefully underneath a fallen log. Even to this day, I still recall the subtle beauty of the bold checkerboard design and distinctive stripe of my first

Checkered Garter snake.

The Checkered Garter snake (Thamnophis marcianus) is a small non-venomous serpent, with most adults reaching sexual maturity between eighteen and twenty four inches in total length. The largest specimen recorded, however, was a whopping 42 inches, but that specimen was definitely an exception to this species size rule. Like most other species in its genus, it has three stripes that run longitudinally on its body. The most distinctive stripe is the bright yellow one that runs along the spine, while the other two pale lines run most other harmless snakes lengthwise along the sides on the third scale row above the belly scales. In between the stripes are two rows of bold square shaped dark spots that alternate along the length of the snake, giving this reptile its namesake. The background August. Most of the garter snake species are rarely encountered far from water, and this one is no exception. However, with its range in Texas being the semiarid to arid western three quarters of the state, the Checkered Garter snake is far better adapted to living in dry environments than most of the other native garter snakes. It is an abundant snake, thriving in the dry grasslands of the Panhandle as well as in the Tamualipan thornscrub of the southern portion of the state. It is also a common sight throughout the Edwards Plateau and the Trans-Pecos regions. Wherever it occurs, permanent

As with almost all other reptiles that reside in temperate climates, they undergo a period of inactivity during the coldest months of the year, allowing sexually mature adults to generate the sperm and eggs necessary for successful reproduction in the spring. However, unlike found in Texas, Checkered Garter snakes are oviviparous, or live-bearing animals. Mating occurs primarily during the months of April and May, and the young are usually born sometime between late June and midas few as three to as many as thirty, although the average litter size is around 13. The deliwider than the neck, is olive and cate babies, who are between 6 and 9 inches in length, typically mimic the adults in color and pattern and are capable of fending for themselves from the

moment they are born.

Checkered Garter snakes are diurnal (daytime active) during their foraging activities in the spring and fall, then they become nocturnal when the temperatures of summer reach temperatures too unbearable for most cold-blooded animals. Many are observed crossing roads during and immediately after rainstorms as they search for their primary prey of frogs and toads. Earthworms are also consumed, as well as the occasional lizard. It is because of this diet that many Checkered Garter snakes are found even in urban areas, as many are drawn to gardens in search of prey. However, like the majority of snakes that occur in this state, they are completely harmless to



Cross Plains Volunteer Fire help build their department. Department recently received a grant in the amount of \$18,000 from Texas A&M Forest Service to purchase a new slip-on unit to put on one of their fire trucks.

Ever since the wildfire that wiped out much of Cross Plains in December 2005, the VFD has worked to improve efficiency by updating its equipment so they can better prepare for these types of events.

The wildfire destroyed more than 100 homes and took the lives of two Cross Plains residents.

"We have been working with Cross Plains VFD ever since the big incident to better their capacity", TFS Regional Fire Coordinator Charles Tice said. This new unit will expand their capabilities more than anything, and help out on mutual aid. TFS wants to do anything we can to

Carouth said the grant came at a time when they were trying to build and update three new pieces of equipment for the department.

"We needed to update our old equipment," Carouth said. We put the slip-on unit on one of our new trucks. Now we have a brand new truck with new equipment that won't break down and require as much maintenance as our older trucks

TFS passes approximately \$12.8 million along to volunteer fire departments across the state every year, helping them purchase equipment to better protect lives and property.

"TFS is the only thing that keeps us going", Carouth said. "They have been very good to us over the years".
