June rain dampens drought, wet winter may quench it If you haven't figured it out by
now, the one thing that is pre-
dictable about Texas weather is
dictable about Texas weather is
that it is utterly unpredictable.
Just when it looked like the Bra Just when it looked like the Bra-
zos basin was entering another summer with little improvement in the hydrologic drought, along
came the May and June storms came the May and June storms
that may not have busted the drought but certainly put a dent
in it. Nevertheless, the drough plaguing the basin continues, months are ahead of us. Fortunately, climatologists are say-
ing there could be some positive ing there could be so
news come winter. Over about a 24 -hour period from June 21 to 22, a series of
squall lines and thunderstorms squall lines and thunderstorms
dropped several inches of rain across wide swaths of the Bra
zos basin. Rainfall amounts varied from 1.5 to 8 inches, with isolated areas getting about 10
inches. Additional rain systems pushed through the state in the days
following. Together, these June rains brought a long-needed rise
in the water level at some Brazos in the water level at some Brazos
basin reservoirs. Lake Granbury saw the most improvement. The water level, which had fallen
more than 11 feet below full more than 11 feet below full after years of drought, rose by
about 7 feet over a few days. Other basin lakes benefitted as well. Lake Whitney's water
level went up 4.5 feet. Lake level went up 4.5 feet. Lake
Aquilla filled up and moved into Aquilla Aled up and moved into further into its flood pool. While
Lake Possum Kingdom's water Lake Possum Kingdom's water
