## The Recipe Corner

Homemade Lemon Bars
Prep Time: $\mathbf{2 5}$ Minutes Bake Time: 20 minutes + cooling

## Ingredients:

1 cup all-purpose flour $1 / 3$ cup butter, softened $1 / 4$ cup confectioners' sugar Topping:
2 eggs

* 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
* 2 tablespoons lemon juice
* 3/4 teaspoon lemon extract
* 3/4 teaspoon baking powder
* $1 / 4$ teaspoon salt

Confectioners' sugar
Orange peel strips (1 to 3 inches) optional

## Directions

* Preheat over to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, beatt flour, butter and confectioners sugar until blended. Press onto bottom of an ungreased 8 -inch square baking dish. Bake 15-20 minutes or until lightly browned.
* For topping, in a large bowl, beat eggs, sugar, flour, lemon juice, extract, baking
powder and salt until frothy; pour over hot crust. powder and salt until frothy; pour over hot crust.
* Bake 10-15 minutes longer or until light golden brown. Cool completely in dish on a wire rack. Dust with confectioners' sugar. If desired, sprinkle with orange peel strips.

Yield: 9 servings.
