old. His unit participated in old. His unit participated in
several battles, and he served with distinction. At the age of 17, Lanham was wounded at the bloody Battle of Spotsylvania Courthouse in Virginia. ham married, and left for Texas. After his arrival, he worked as a school teacher for several years,
first near Clarksville and then in Bowie County before moving to Weatherford. Like many other frontier teachers, he was interested in furthering his own studied law in his spare time In 1869, he was admitted to the state bar. Lanham impressed locals with veloped powerful connections. In 1871, Gov. Edmund J. Davis appointed him as district attorney, a position he would hold

There's no safe way to use consumer fireworks
June 28, 2016 - As the
Fourth of July approaches, Fourth of July approaches,
the National Fire Protection
Association ( Association (NFPA) is no safe way to use consumer fireworks. According to NFPA,
coordinator of the Alliance to coordinator of the Alliance to
Stop Consumer Fireworks, U.S Stop Consumer Fireworks, U.S.
fire departments responded to an annual average of 18,500 fires caused by fireworks
between 2009 and 2013 . These between 2009 and 2013 . These
fires included 1,300 structure
fires, 300 vehicle fires, 16,000 outside and other fires, and killed two people per year. Last year, two NFL players
made headlines by losing made headlines by losing
fingers in accidents involving fireworks. The two separate
high-profile incidents raised high-profile incidents raised
awareness about the dangers awareness about the da
of consumer fireworks. Almost half (47 percent) of the fires reported on Independence
Day in the $1 . S$ Day in the U.S. during
this period were started by this period were started by
fireworks, more than any other cause of fire. However, the vast
majority of fireworks majority of fireworks injuries occur without a fire starting.
According to the Consumer According to the Consumer
Product Safety Commission (Croduct , more than half of
fireworks injuries each year fireworks injuries each year are to extremities - hand or finger
( 36 percent), legs ( 14 percent), and arms ( 5 percent). Most of the remaining injuries were to parts of the head ( 38 percent),
including the eye ( 16 percen incluaing

Take precautions to avoid rare, dangerous Amoeba on Texas rivers and lakes

WACO, Texas (June 15, 2016) - Warm weather in the
Brazos River basin and the Brazos River basin and the
upcoming holiday make this a great time to enjoy area rivers and lakes. However,
the conditions that make the he conditions that make the
water temperature enticing also foster the growth of a rare but dangerous microorganism. Primary amebic
meningoencephalitis meningoencephalitis (PAM)
is a rare disease caused by Naegleria fowleri, an amoeba found in almost all untreated, resh surface water and in soil.
The amoeba thrives in The amoeba thrives in low
levels of fresh water that is warmer than 80 degrees and stagnant or slow-moving. The
PAM infection occurs when PAM infection occurs when water containing the organism
is forced intothe nasal passages - usually from diving or jumping
into water or from water sking into water or from water skiing. The amoeba makes its way
into the brain and spinal cord, destroying brain tissue.
Symptoms of the infection
include severe headache, include severe headache,
high fever, stiff neck, nausea high fever, stiff neck, nausea,
vomiting, seizures and hallucinations as the condition worsens. Although PAM is rare,
those infected usually succumb those infected usually succumb
to the disease within a week. to the disease within a week.
There were 34 known cases There were 34 known cases
of PAM in Texas between
1962 and 2015 according 1962 and 2015 , according the
national Centers for Disease national Centers for Disease
Control and Prevention. The Texas Department of State Health Services confirmed
two cases of PAM in Texas in two cases of PAM in Texas in
2015. Most cases occurred in 2015. Most cases occurred in
children, ages $9-12$, with a children, ages $9-12$, with a
history of exposure to surface
water during water during warm summer
months. months.
For many years, Naegleria fo $\begin{aligned} & \text { leri infections were } \\ & \text { considered to be fatal with no }\end{aligned}$ specific treatments available. However, in recent years, there
have been a few patients with have been a few patients with
confirmed cases of PAM that conirmed cases of PAM nave survived. Of those who have contracted the disease,
there are three known survivors
since 1962, including Kali Hardig of Arkansas, who was infected in 2013. To prevent infection, it is
recommended that those recommended that those taking part in warm, fresh
water-related activities use nose clips or hold their noses shut while jumping into water. With the amoeba often found in soil, it is best to avoid stirring
up underwater sediment. The Texas Department of Health ecommends that people eavoid stagnant or polluted water and
take "No Swimming" signs seriously. PAM cannot be by drinking water. Swimming pools and hot tubs that are
properly cleaned, maintained
and chlorinated and chlorinated are generally
safe, as is salt water safe, as is salt water. The Texas Department
of State Health Services recommends that anyone experiencing symptoms of
PAM should be evaluated immediately by a physician The physician should be taken part that the patient has surface water. The disease has mistakenly been diagnosed as the flu or meningitis. Providing the physician with information swimming in surface water will allow for appropriate testing to e undertaken quickly.
