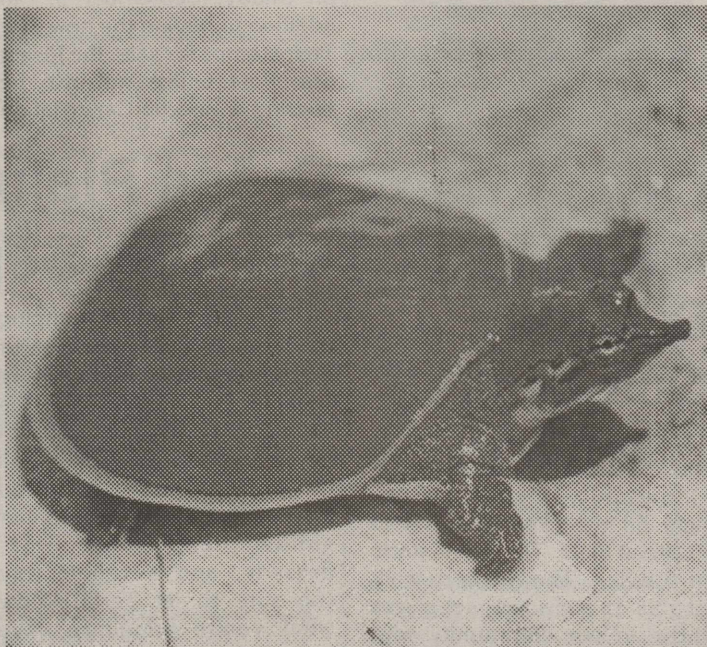
### Spiny Soft-shelled Turtle

The main purpose of a turtle's shell is for protection from predators, and almost all of the native species have a protective shell that is structurally hard. However, one species that is a common sight in our bodies of water lacks that hard shell, and that species is aptly named the soft-shelled turtle.

Spiny Soft-shelled Turtles (*Apalone spinifer*) naturally occur consistently throughout the eastern half of Texas. In the western half of this state, its range is a bit more scattered. Here in the western portions of the state, this almost entirely aquatic species is found primarily in the river drainages of the Rio Grande, Pecos, Concho, Colorado, Canadian, and Red Rivers, as well as any of their tributaries. Outside of Texas, this species resides in the southeastern states, as well as disjunct populations in California, Arizona, and Montana. It is an introduced species in many areas of northeastern Mexico, and has even been observed on the other side of the "pond" in France.

This species of aquatic turtle occupies just about any lake, pond, canal, river or even spring-fed creek in its range. All that is required for their survival is there must be at least a minimal amount of vegetation available for cover and for basking purposes, although many are observed basking on the shoreline when there are no other areas to bask.

As the common name implies, the most diagnostic characteristic used in identifying this species is the relatively "soft" upper shell, or carapace. This shell is rather flat, and many laymen refer to this species as the "pancake turtle". The carapace varies in coloration from a light tan to a dark brown, depending on the age. Older animals typically are much darker colored than the juveniles. The carapace is also outlined with a yellow border; this border is often outlined in black and is much broader towards the back of the turtle than the sides and is non-existent on the front. There are numerous small tubercles on the anterior portion of the carapace that feels like sandpaper, thus giving this species the name "spiny". The legs are colored like the top

shell, and are often flecked with obscure black blotches.

The head is also colored similarly to the carapace. There is a distinct black line that connects the eyes, as well as another thin black line that runs from the nose through the eyes to the back of the throat. Underneath this line is a yellow bar from the eye to the throat. The nose is rather "snorkel-like"; long and extended. Looking rather comical, this species almost has a Pinocchio appearance about it. The neck is unusually long while the tail is comparatively short.

This native turtle is medium sized, with sexually mature adults ranging in carapace size from six inches to twenty one inches in carapace length. Females are the larger sex, attaining lengths of fifteen inches or more, while the males are much smaller, only attaining a carapace length of about seven inches. Mature males also can be distinguished from the females by possessing much longer and thicker tails.

As with most other species of turtles that inhabit the temperate climates, mating occurs in the spring. After mating, the female will lay several clutches of ten to twenty eggs. As with all other reptiles, turtles must lay their eggs on dry land, and to do so, many females will travel long distances over land to find a suitable nesting area. Many

are killed along roadways during this time, and many more are picked up by well-to-do persons who want to re-release them back into the water, all the while unknowingly disrupting her nesting pattern. Once the eggs are laid in the nest, which is dug out with the hind legs of the mother, they incubate for approximately two to three months. Once the inch-long young hatch, they must make the perilous journey back to the water on their own.

This species of turtle is entirely carnivorous. Adults will feast upon various species of fish which it chases down or ambushes, while the juveniles seem to relish softer-bodied animals such as insects and the occasional crustacean.

Soft-shelled Turtles are unique, not just for their Disney character facial appearance and breakfast food shell appearance, but in many other ways. Unlike most other turtles who must surface frequently to draw oxygen for their lungs, this species can absorb oxygen through the permeable shell. On its own accord, soft-shelled turtles can stay submerged for nearly an hour, while in lab tests, with oxygenated water, it can remain submerged for a whopping three months.

SAN ANTONIO, Texas - U.S. Sen. Ted Cruz (R-Texas) today visited U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and military hospitals in San Antonio to discuss the health care challenges facing our nation's veterans and efforts to improve VA service and correct its failures.

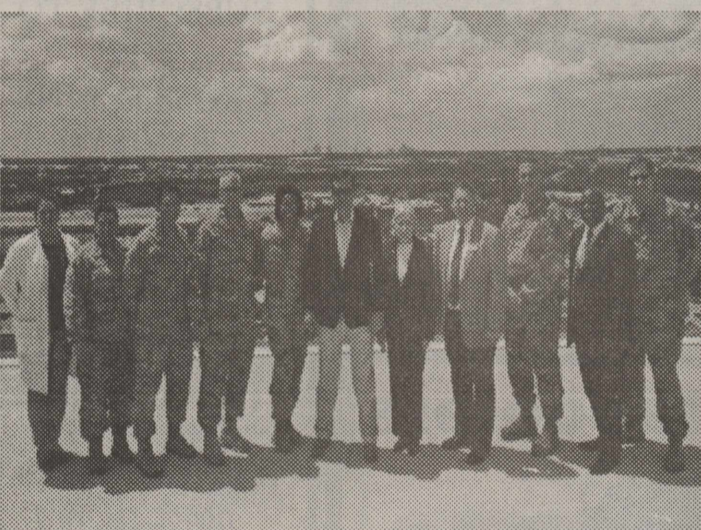
Sen. Cruz first met with officials at San Antonio's Audie L. Murphy Memorial VA Hospital and toured the facility, where he observed the San Antonio Polytrauma Rehabilitation Center and the hospital's three-dimensional prosthetic printing program.

Following his briefing at the VA hospital, Sen. Cruz visited the Brooke Army Medical Center (BAMC) to speak with military leaders, health care providers, and Wounded Warriors. The senator toured BAMC's Center for the Intrepid (CFI) campus, including the Brain Injury Rehabilitation unit and the U.S. Army Institute for Surgical Research (USAISR) Burn Center.

"Home to 1.7 million veterans, the great State of Texas has a deep-seated appreciation for our brave service members. We stand by those who have fought and risked their lives for our security," Sen. Cruz said. "Veterans across our state and country are struggling with the VA on a daily basis, and for far too long, there has been an utter lack of accountability within the department. We made a solemn commitment to our veterans that we have not been honoring, and that failure is unacceptable. I'm confident that the most effective tool to fixing VA mismanagement is expanding choice and empowering veterans to choose their own doctor, and I will continue fighting to provide



Sen. Cruz tours Audie L. Murphy Memorial VA Hospital in San Antonio, observes three-dimensional prosthetic printing program

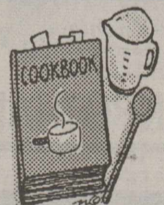


Sen. Cruz tours Brooke Army Medical Center in San Antonio

Prep Time: 10 Minutes Grill Time: 40 Minutes

#### Ingredients:

\* 2 broiler/fryer chickens (3 to 4 pounds each), cut up

#### SPICE RUB:

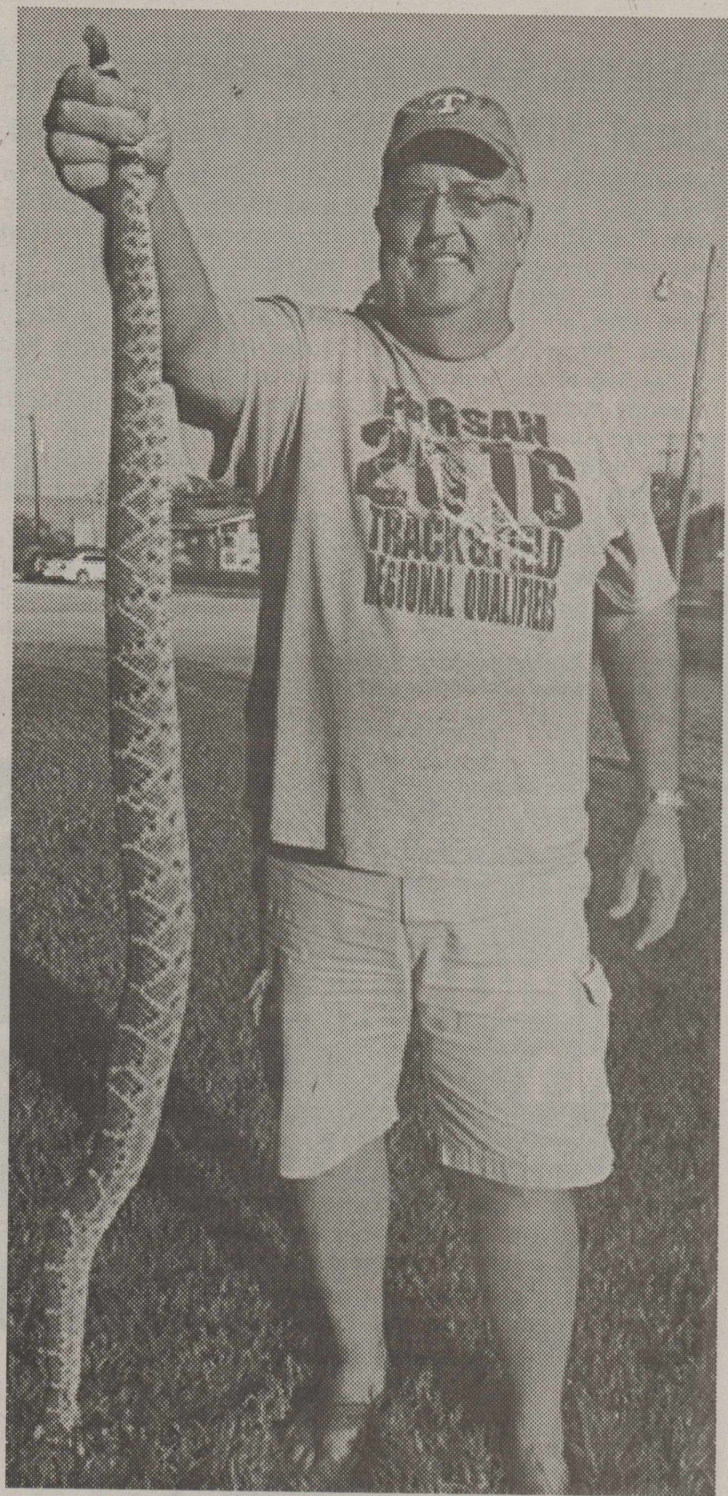
\* 2 tablespoons onion powder  
\* 4 teaspoons salt or salt substitute  
\* 1 tablespoon paprika  
\* 2 teaspoons garlic powder  
\* 1-1/2 teaspoons chili powder  
\* 1-1/2 teaspoons pepper  
\* 1/4 teaspoon ground turmeric  
\* Pinch cayenne pepper

#### SAUCE:

\* 2 cups ketchup  
\* 3 tablespoons brown sugar  
\* 2 tablespoons dried minced onion  
\* 2 tablespoons thawed orange juice concentrate  
\* 1/2 teaspoon liquid smoke, optional

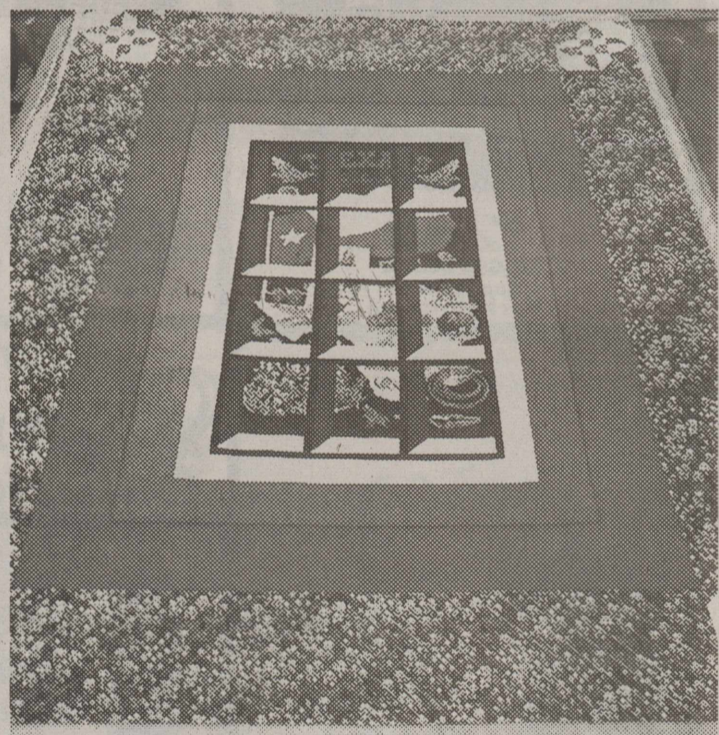
#### Directions

1. Pat chicken pieces dry. In a small bowl, mix spice rub ingredients; reserve 1 tablespoon spice rub for sauce. Rub remaining spice rub on all sides of chicken.  
2. Grill chicken, uncovered, over medium heat 20 minutes, skin side down. Meanwhile, combine all sauce ingredients; stir in reserved spice rub. Turn chicken; grill 20-30 minutes longer or until juices run clear, basting frequently with sauce. Yield: 8 servings.
