## Spray schedule for Pecan Nut Casebearers

Time is approaching to start scouting for one of the most
important nut-infesting insect important nut-infesting insects
of pecans. That is the pecan nut casebearer. The adult casebearer is a gray almost black moth about $1 / 3$ inch long. The moths are active at
night, when they lay pecan nuts. From research and working with producers we
are confident that an egg lay are confident that an egg lay
will occur $7-10$ days after the first catch of the moths using
pheromone traps. pheromone traps. In Callahan
County, a local producer has
caught caught some of the moth but believes we have not hit
the peak. Engs the peak. Eggs are oval, flat
and tiny, just large enough to be seen with the unaided
eye.

## The Texas History Minute Sponsored by: HANNER CHEVROLET <br> Inventor of Liquid Paper-Bette Nasmith Graham of Dallas

## An obstacle can be an oppor- unity for an enterprising spirit. tunity for an enterprising spirit. This was the case for Texas inventor Bette Nesmith Graham. What had been an annoyance for typists led to the struggling single mother creating a new tool for mother creating a new tool for offices and a multi-million dollar business. A single inspiration led Graham to invent the typing correction fluid she came to call Liquid Paper. Born Bette C Dallas in March Clair McMurray in up in San Antonio. She was a difficult student in school as her

 stubborn personality led her to clash often with her teachers.As a result, she dropped out at age 17 and later completed night school. She married Warren Nesmith in 1942, and the couple had a son, Michael,
ater that year. later that year.
Her husband World War II in 1942 . After his return, the marriage collapsed; and the couple divorced in 1946. Newly divorced and
haquing a young son to care for she found a job as a secretary. Unfortunately, she did not know how to type very well, which was a vital office skill.After her father's death, Nesmith moved
back to Dallas with her mother and sister. She accepted a secretarial position at Texas Bank and Trust in the early 1950s and eventually workedher way to the position of executive secretary when typing. Typewriter erasers were available, but their effectiveness were
limited to the kind of typewriter limited to the kind of typewriter
ribbon used and often did not erase completely. In professions where precision were essential to avoiding any type of legal problem, this meant absolute perfection with any typed documistake meant that the typist had to begin again. This wasted time and paper and caused considerable frustration, from newspapers to students typing
reports to businesses eager for efficiency and perfection. One day, she happened to o serve some sign painters. While precision was important in thei work as well, she noted that the when they made a mistake-the simply painted over it. Inspired she began applying water-based long, other secretaries began to find out about her correction fluid, and it soon became a hit She steadily refined the formula

By 1964, the company producing 5,000 bottles per week. By 1967, the company was working out of its own factory site in Dallas. Ten years after
she launched Liquid Paper the she launched Liquid Paper, the bottles per day and made \$1 million bottles in 1970 alone. Graham moved her company into a new, 35,000 -square foot
facility in Dallas in 1975 facility in Dallas in 1975. Re-
membering her own struggles, membering her own struggles,
she made sure that the site had special amenities for her employees, including a library and
a day care center. a day care center. Employees
noted that she was practical and generous and had made and generous and had made a focal point of the business.
She established the Beuty Claire She established the Betty Claire
McMurray Foundation in 1976, McMurray Foundation in 1976,
named after her mother, to help women in business.
As her health began to fail, Graham sold Liquid Paper to the Gillette Company, known mostly for selling razors, in Septembe
1979 for $\$ 47.5$ million (or $\$ 169$ million in 2017 dollars). Graham died in May 1980 at the age o 56. In spite of the eclipse of the typewriter by the modern computer, Liquid Paper remains
a popular product. Sometimes a simple observation and hard work can produce a multi-million dollar innovation.

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest)
before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You will receive written notice before the deadine, the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You request a hearing in the
of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may reque evening or on a Saturday or Sunday. Prior to your hearing, you may ask to review the evidence the CAD plans to introduce at the hearing to establish any matter at issue. The law provides that before a hearing on a protest or immediately after the hearing begins, you or your agent and the CAD shall each provide the other with a copy of any materials - whether in paper
or electronic form - intended to be offered or submitted to the ARB at the hearing. (Multiple or electronic form - intien of these materials typically must be brought to the hearing so that each ARB member has a copy of all the materials to review.) To the greatest extent practicable, the hearing will be informal. You or a designated agent may appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The CAD representative
will present evidence about your case You may cross-examine the CAD representative. The will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the CAD representative. The
ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. In most cases, the CAD has the burden of establishing the property's value by a preponderance of the evidence presented. In certain protests, the chief appraiser has the burden of proving the property's value by clear and convincing evidence. You should review ARB hearing procedures to learn more about evidence and related matters. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal
district office or from the Comptroller of Public Accounts. at comptroller.texas. gov /taxinfo/ district office or from comptroiner of Pubic Accouns law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they have not talked about your case before the ARB hears it.
Review by the District Court, an Arbitrator or SOAH After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you are not satisfied with the decision, you
have the right to appeal. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 60 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. In certain cases, as an alternative to filing an appeal in district court, you may file, not later than the 45th day after you receive notice of the ARB order, a request for binding arbitration with the county appraisal district. In certain cases, you may appeal to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH). An

order, filing with the chief appraiser of the county appraisal district a notice of appeal. Appeals to district court, binding arbitration, or SOAH all require payment of certain fees or deposits. Tax Payment

## Isual Deadline

On or before April 30 for residence homesteads and May 31 for all other property (or within 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later). Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. The ARB decides whether you hav good cause.

For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change did not result from a protest you filed), the deadline is not later than the 30th day after the notice of the change was delivered to you. (You may insert deadline for protes concerning omitted property if doing so would avoid taxpayer confusion.)

## Special Deadlines

For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisa because you changed the use of your land), the deadline is not later than the 30th day after the notice of the determination was delivered to you. If you believe the appraisal district or ARB should have sent you a notice and did not, you may file a protest unt the day before claim you received a tax bill from one or more of the taxing units that tax your property. The ARB decides whether it will hear your case based on evidence about whether a required notice was mailed to you.
